

Faced by Jim Southworth, an all-around star who jumped, vaulted, hurled and tossed his way to five first places and a second, the University of Miami track squad overwhelmed Florida State University's cinder team 95-35 here yesterday afternoon.

The Seminoles were limited to three first places in the dual meet. Tom Bowman snatched the 220-yard low hurdles, Brick Bradford copped the shot put and Bill Duncan won the mile.

Miami sprinters Elmer Russell and Dick Johnson scorched the cinders winning the 100 and 220 dashes in record times.
