CLINTON, Miss.—Florida State University's once-beaten track team swept the field events yesterday to defeat Mississippi College 86-45 and give the Seminoles their fifth win over a college squad.

Freshman Carlos Fraundorfer paced the FSU win with three first places in the shot put, broad jump and discus. Fraundorfer set a new school record in the shot with a heave of 44 feet 5 $\frac{3}{4}$  inches. It was the fourth straight meet that the Tampa boy had increased his distance.

Fraundorfer leaped 21' 2" in the broad jump and heaved the discus 126' 8".

Bill Whaley copped the javelin for the Seminoles with a toss of 161' 4".

Joe Fracassi copped the pole vault, going 12 feet six inches and Paul Scraparu won the high jump at five-eight.

In the track events the Seminole quartet of Pete-Nimkoff, Harvey Haegerty, Jack Koonce and Bill Wagoner copped the mile relay in 3:35.2.

Seminole spring star Johnny Poston, who did not run in the 100 which was won by the Choc-taws, grabbed the 220 in perhaps the finest race of the day. Poston did 21.7 around a curve.

Wagoner set a new record in the 880, ripping around in 2 minutes one and five-tenths second.

Woody Parker beat Poston in the quarter-mile in 50.5.

Joe Murphy was a double winner for the Chocs, copping both the hurdles. Mississippi College also took the 100, mile and two-mile.
