ATLANTA, Ga.—Florida State's Joe Fracassi vaulted 12' 8" to tie for first place in the star-studded Georgia AAU track and field meet here last night. Fracassi wound up his fourth varsity year with the Seminoles by sharing honors with Bryant of Mississippi.

Dick Mize, who captained FSU to a 3-2 record in dual competition this year, ran third in a stalling open quarter to Auburn's SEC champion Don Johnson, who clocked :45.5.

Mize, also wearing the Garnet and Gold for the last time, was clocked in :45.7, the best he had ever run.

FSU sophomore Ken Jarrett, third member of Coach Kenneth Miller's squad to make the trip, was sixth in a fast two-mile run. All the meet times were good, paced by a 1:54 which Tennessee's Frank Albertson rang up in the 880.

Auburn, claimed team honors from some of the South's best cinder squads. However, Florida's Gators, Southeastern Conference champions, were only lightly represented, and Tallahassee's J. Papa Hall did not jump.
