

Florida Wins State Relays From Auburn

GAINESVILLE, March 27 (AP)—Joe Shankle had record-setting speed and spirit to take top individual honors of the Florida Relays track carnival today.

The Duke University junior won the high hurdles in a record 14.3 seconds, tied for second in the high jump, placed third in the broad jump and ran a leg in the quarter-mile relay—all in spite of an injured heel.

The host University of Florida, defending Southeastern Conference track champion, won the unofficial team title for the second straight year, scoring 31 points to 26 for second-place Auburn. Points are not given officially; the unofficial total being based on 5-3-2-1 for individual events and 7-4-3-2 for relays.

THREE PLACES FOR FSU

Florida State University placed in three events to finish 11th with a total of seven points. Seminole team captain Carlos Fraundorfer bagged fourth place in the discus with a heave of 133 feet, three-fourths inch.

FSU's sprint medley relay team, composed of Joe Davis, Jimmy Casteel, Larry Hountha and Fraundorfer, placed second behind North Carolina in that event. The Seminoles' mile relay team earned a fourth place.

North Carolina was third in unofficial team points with 21. Shankle's performance boosted Duke to fourth with 20 and South Carolina was fifth with 19½.
