

GAINESVILLE, March 30 (AP) — Five records fell and one was tied in the Florida Relays today which were dominated by a versatile and deep Louisiana State University track team.

The Kearney-Rayburn Trophy, given annually to the outstanding individual, was awarded Fred Berman, Georgia Tech's weight man, who was the only double winner.

Berman took the shot put with a new record toss of 55 feet 2 inches and also won the discus.

Dave Sime, Duke University sprinter who won the Kearney-Rayburn Trophy last year, copped the 100-yard dash but probably lost his chance to repeat as trophy winner when a teammate dropped the baton in the 440-yard relay and Sime didn't get to run his leg of the race.

He didn't enter any other events. Last year he won the broad jump and ran in two or three relays but this spring is concentrating more on baseball, which he plans as a career.

In addition to Berman's record shot put, new marks were posted by North Carolina's 2-mile relay team, Maryland's distance relay team, Bill Duckworth of Georgia in the javelin and LSU's medley relay team.

LSU's quadruple relay team tied the record in that race.

An overflow crowd of 4,000 saw LSU win six of the 15 events and place in nearly all of them. No team points are kept.

Jim Beatty of North Carolina had such an easy time winning the 2-mile run he didn't approach the record of 9 minutes 19.8 seconds he set last year.
