FSU's Mike Conley gained a first place in the mile run, turning in a respectable 4:27.5 time. And the Seminoles' mile relay team, comprised of Conley, Jack Terwilliger, Doyle Ruff, and Jim Casteel, flashed home first to give FSU another blue ribbon.
