

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP)—Florida State's state track team won the second annual Coliseum Indoor Relays Saturday night with 26 points.

Alabama and the University of Florida were tied for second with 18 points with the pole vault championship still undecided and with Alabama's John Eulises fighting for the title.

Only four events in the total of 23 runoff Saturday afternoon and night failed to see new records established. Last year's best marks were surpassed in nine events out of 11 in the college competition, nine out of 10 in the high school class and one out of two college dashman events.

Mike Conner gave Florida State 10 points by setting new records in the mile and the two mile runs. He did the mile in 4:18.1 and then a short while later ran the two mile distance in 9:50.3.

Louisiana State, last year's champion, did not compete in the meet this year.

Tuscaloosa High School repeated its 1957 championship in the high school competition with 19 points. Ensley was second with 12½. Gadsden placed third with 11.

Billy Jennings gave Ensley 10 of its 12½ points by setting new records in the 880 and the mile. His time for the 880 was 2:05.7 and 4:43.2 for the mile.
