

GREENVILLE, S. C.—Florida State's track team racked up 74½ points here yesterday to win the Piedmont Relays over a field of 11 teams.

FSU's Jim Casteel was voted the outstanding performer in the university class. He anchored the Seminole relay teams which swept the meet and was the main factor in the winning total. grabbed a fourth place in the same event.

Furman and The Citadel tied for second place with 49½ points each. The balance of the teams in their order of finish were: Tennessee, 29; East Carolina, 27; Clemson, 24½; East Tennessee, 23½; High Point, 16; Presbyterian, 10½; Guilford, 8; Wake Forest, 4.

Tom Chivers was third in the high hurdles and Ted Keen was second in the 100-yard-dash. Don Ostergaard placed third in the shotput and Charles Drago
