ATLANTA — Showing no ill'effects after a three-week layoff, the Florida State Seminoles won the Georgia AAU track
meet handily today — as expected.

The Seminoles piled up 53 points. Georgia Tech was second with 34 and the Atlanta Striders, led by the indefatigable Buddy Fowlkes, took third with 133,

Coach Mike Long's Seminoles closed their 1959 season with their fourth team title. FSU's freshman squad scored 12 points.

Seventeen athletes, 11 varsity and six freshman performers, had a hand in the scoring for FSU, which earlier had claimed crowns in the Coliseum and Piedmont Relays and the Florida AAU meet.

The Seminole varsity took only one first place, the mile relay. Freshman Quentin Till won the 440-yard dash, edging a varsity speedsters Ron Harrison and Claude Grizzard.

FSU co-captain Jim Casteel finished third in the 100, second in the 220, and anchored i

the winning relay team. Ted I Keen finished second in the - 100 and third in the 220.

Fowlkes, individual star of the meet, piled up 1534 points with three first-place finishes and a leg on the mile relay in which his Striders finished third. Fowlkes, a former Tech star, has competed in this meet every year for the past decade.

The 32-year-old Atlantan wen the 100 yard dash, the 220 and the broad jump. His time in the 100 was 9.7, tying the meet record he set three years ago.

FSU, strong pre-meet favorite, won only one event — the mile relay — but finished second in seven events, third in three, fourth in four and fifth in three.

Only one record was broken. Henry Wadsworth, former University of Florida athlete competing unattached, soared 14 feet 1/4 inch in the pole vault bettering by 1/4 inch the old mark held by another ex-Gator, Leroy Poucher.

James Brantley of Georgia
Tech won the Bert Prather
Trophy for his victory in the
high hurdles. Prather, the late

Atlanta Constitution sports writer, was one of the organizers
of the annual Georgia AAU
meet. Brantley edged Ron AU
lowich of the Striders and the
favorite, Don Goodroe of South
Carolina, in 14.5, one-tenth of
a second off the record.
