

MONTGOMERY, ALA. (AP)—

The sensational Styron Twins, Don and Dave, led Northeast Louisiana State to victory tonight in the annual Coliseum relays.

The terrific twins scored 21 of Northeast Louisiana's 43 points and helped add five more by running the first and final legs of the mile relay which their school won.

Kentucky was second in the meet with 20 points and the Florida State Seminoles, who won the championship the past two years, were third with 16.

In the high school competition, Ronnie Haynes and Norwood Fleming scored 17 points for Lanier to give the Montgomery school first place.

The lone Florida State winner was high jumper Steve Long, son of FSU coach Mike Long. He cleared the bar at 6-2½ inches.

Mike O'Brien, also of FSU, tied Joe Leightnam of Auburn and Bob Swafford of Clemson for second place in the same event. All three jumped 6-0.

FSU's Tom Keeney placed second in the mile run, and Ron Harrison finished fourth in the 60-yard dash. Don Ostergaard was fourth in the shot put.

FSU's mile relay team finished second in that event as did the Frosh mile relay unit. Craig Johnson was third in the freshmen 60-yard dash.
