

Senior Ron Harrison breezed to three first places and played an important role in a fourth as Florida State turned back University of Miami, 95-41, in a season-opening dual track meet here yesterday.

A pair of Seminole juniors shattered their own school records as FSU won 13 of the 16

events in a surprisingly strong early showing.

Don Ostergaard of Fort Myers topped his school shot put mark by nearly three feet, heaving the iron ball 52 feet, 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

Steve Long, one of two sons Seminole Coach Mike Long has competing on the varsity, cleared the high-jump bar at 6-5 $\frac{3}{4}$ for

new FSU school and track records. Long's previous school record was 6-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ set earlier this year and he had plenty of urging for the new record yesterday.

Sophomore George Smith of Miami High jumped 6-4 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches to spur Steve Long to his record height.

Harrison turned in a brilliant early-season effort. The lanky Orlandoan won the 100 and 220-yard dashes, the low hurdles, and ran a leg on FSU's winning 880-yard relay team.

A favoring wind kept Harrison from making a sparkling entry in the FSU entry book. He covered the 220-yard dash in 20.7 seconds, one-tenth of a second faster than the record held for years by John Poston. But gusty, eight-10-mile-an-hour winds ruled out the record.

The one-sided triumph was FSU's sixth in a row over the Hurricanes and left the Seminoles with a 7-4 lead in the intra-state series.

Miami managed first places in the pole vault (Bob Rosbaugh), high hurdles (Roy Pugh), and javelin (Frank DeFazio).

The Seminoles swept the top two places in six events and in one event—the broad jump—grabbed all nine points when Keith Crawford, Billy Welch, and Tim Edney finished 1-2-3.

FSU won both the 880-yard relay and mile relay handily.

"We have made good progress," said a happy Mike Long after the meet. "If we can continue to improve, we should have a respectable season."

The Seminoles step out next in the Hollywood Relays at Hollywood Saturday. Then follow tough dual meets here with Furman and Southeastern Conference champion Louisiana State.
