

Breezing to eight first places and a tie for a ninth first place, Florida State's Seminoles rolled to their third consecutive Florida Invitational AAU track championship here last night.

The Seminoles piled up 65 3-4 points to outclass a field of seven other entries. Florida's Gators were a distant second with 39 1/4 points, Georgia third with 16 1/2 points, the Atlanta Striders fourth with 15 points and Miami fifth with 14 points.

Farther back were FSU's Freshmen (6), Miami's Freshmen (5 1/2), and Florida's Freshmen (2).

Four state AAU records were broken—two by the Seminoles—and a fifth record was tied before a heavy downpour slowed the last few events.

FSU's Ron Harrison, Orlando senior, ran a brilliant 20.3-second 220-yard dash to erase the Florida AAU record and the Seminole school record set in 1952 by Tom Poston. Don Ostergaard, Seminole junior from Fort Myers, tossed the shot 50 feet, 5 3/4 inches for a new AAU mark.

Bill Duckworth of the Atlanta Striders awed a crowd of 1,000 with a heave of 243 feet, 7 1/2 inches in the javelin. That effort was nearly two feet more than Duckworth threw in setting the record last year.

Florida's Ron Allen clopped nearly four seconds off the 880-yard run record set by FSU's Doyle Ruff last year. Allen zipped the 880 in 1:52.9. Miami's Bobby Sher tied the Florida AAU standard in the 100-yard dash with a 9.6-second effort. Sher was timed in 9.6 in the preliminary heat, also.

Tom Keeney, FSU's reliable senior from Miami, was the meet's only clear double winner, copping the mile and two-mile

runs. Florida's Henry Wadsworth won the high jump at 6-3 but had to settle for a four-way first place tie at 13 feet in the pole vault when rain made the approach too slippery.

Wadsworth set the AAU state mark with a vault of 14 feet, 1 1/4 inches last year.

The meet was State's final home appearance this season. Coach Mike Long's hard-working Tribe, undefeated this year in dual meets, will compete next in the Georgia AAU meet in Atlanta May 28.
