

ATLANTA—Nine members of Florida State's track team, spurred by double-winners Ron Harrison and Tom Kenney, compiled enough points to win the Georgia AAU track meet here Saturday had they been running as a team.

The Seminoles, defending meet champions, did not enter on a team basis because final exams are in progress. Georgia Tech's cinder squad grabbed the title.

Harrison won the 220 in 20.7 and sped the 440 in 48.0 to win that event. Kenney grabbed first in the mile run with a 4:18.4 time and first in the two-mile with a 9:42.0 showing. Both are seniors.

Dave Ellis placed second in the high hurdles, and freshman Herbie Kraft notched a second in

the broad jump at 23-0.

Senior Ted Keen was second in the 100 and third in the 220. Claude Grizzard was third in the high jump, Kent Mills was fourth in the two-mile run and the mile relay team of Ralph Parkman, Terry Long, Grizzard and Ellis finished second behind the Auburn Freshmen.
