

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Arkansas's Southwest Conference Razorbacks edged Alabama, 50-44½, for the team title in the Memphis Jaycee Indoor Relays here yesterday.

Florida State's Seminoles scored 30½ points to finish fourth. Northeast Louisiana had 31 points and other leaders in the fast field of 13 colleges were Clemson (30 points) and Georgia and Georgia Tech (15 each).

Coach Mike Long's Seminoles scored in eight of the 12 events with Long's son, Steve, and George Smith tying for first place in the high jump.

FSU's Herb Kraft placed third in the broad jump. Terry Long, another son of the Seminole coach, was third in the 70-yard low hurdles. Ed Hays finished fifth in the pole vault and Don Ostergaard fifth in the shot put.

In relay competition, the Seminoles finished third in the 30-lap relay (300 yards each), and fourth in both the 12-lap and 8-lap relays.

FSU opens its dual meet season at Miami next month.
