PHILADELPHIA (AP)—
Villanova whipped to three victories including the mile for the seventh year in a row, while Abilene Christian had to be content with a single triumph Saturday in the Penn Relays.

The mile, final event on the long program, was run in light rain before a Franklin Field crowd of

Florida State's George Smith finished second in the high jump with a leap of 6-4. Mike Long was in a 3-way tie for third with a 6-2.

Don Ostergaard finished sixth in his division of shotput with 51-1/4 throw. Sprint medley relay team was third in second section, and mile relay team placed second in its section.

37,808. Villanova ripped home in 3:14.3 in the eight-team field.

Villanova's Joe Manion, Nick Deangelis, Bob Raemore and Paul Drayton also won last year. NYU was second. Villanova also won the half-mile in 1:24:8, a stunning upset over Abilene Christian, and the 480-yard shuttle hurdle relayin 1:00.8.

Abilene, which had headed for Philadelphia with hopes of becoming the third team in the 67-year history of the giant carnival to win four events, had to settle for one—the 440 in 40.9. This tied the Texans' own meet record.

Yale and Michigan each picked up another triumph for doubles. Yale captured the sprint medley relay in 3.25.5 and the Wolverines took the two-mile relay in 7.34.2. Friday Yale won the distance medley and Michigan the four-mile.

The mile defeat was a hard one for Abilene Christian to take. The team holds the world record of 3:07.9.

But Dennis Richardson got laught in the crowded field, and once he went sprawling, AC was out of it and wound up sixth.
