

GAINESVILLE—Florida State's hustling trackmen rang up their fourth straight State AAU title here yesterday in a meet that saw five records fall and a sixth tied.

The Seminoles' Quentin Hill was among four double winners. He sped the 440 in 48.1 and tied Buddy Fowlkes of the Atlanta Striders in the 220 with a 21.4.

FSU compiled 54½ points, ahead of Miami's 42. The Striders had 24, Florida 17 and the Tallahassee Athletic Club one.

FSU won six events in all and broke two of the records. Don Ostergaard won the shot put with a record-breaking 51-7¾ heave. The mile relay unit ran the distance in a new time of 3:19.8.

Other Seminole winners were Terry Long in the low hurdles (23.8), Dave Ellis in the highs (15.0), and Herb Kraft in the broad jump (23¼).

Gene Giddens tied for second in the broad jump. Terry Long was fourth in the high hurdles. George Smith finished second in the high jump and Steve Long tied for third in the same event. Also tied for third was Tom

Bourne of the Tallahassee Athletic Club.

Bill Davis and Jack Brocksmith were second and third in the 880. Craig Johnson was fourth in the 220. Ken Mills finished third in the 2-mile run. Jeff Clark was third in the discus.

In second place in the low hurdles was former FSU team member Claude Grizzard, now with the Atlanta Striders.
