

1 ATLANTA (AP)—Husky Rich-  
1 ard Crane, setting a new record  
in the shot put and winning the  
discus, brought Auburn to victory  
in the Georgia AAU Track and  
Field Meet here yesterday, three  
points ahead of Florida State.

Auburn totaled 46. A pared  
down 11-man FSU contingent  
scored 43. Atlanta Striders and  
Georgia Tech finished third and  
fourth with 31 and 27 in the 13-  
team field.

Crane's record throw in the shot  
went 56-7, bettering the 55-8 $\frac{3}{4}$   
set by Ed Nutting last year.  
Georgia Tech's Nutting came in  
second this year.

FSU's Quintin Till was the lone  
Seminole winner, running the 440  
in 47.8.

The Seminoles' Terry Long  
finished second in the 220 and  
440 hurdles fourth in the 120 hur-  
dles. Jeff Clark was fourth in the  
shot put and discus.

Steve Long was second in the  
high jump and George Smith  
fourth in the same event. Herb  
Craft finished second in the  
broad jump. Dave Ellis was third  
in the 120 hurdles. Craig Johnson  
was second in the 220, and Jack  
Brooksmith fifth in the 880.

The mile relay team came home  
third, Barry Topper was fifth in  
the shotput and freshman Al  
Williams finished in the same  
position in the discus.
