Florida State's track team won 13 of 17 events to sweep by Southern Conference power Furman, 99-45, here Saturday afternoon.

It was the second victory in two dual starts for the Seminoles who defeated Miami, 89%. 55% last Saturday. Miami and Furman were the only teams to beat FSU in dual competition last season.

The Seminoles piled up their points in the field events and dashes. Furman's only first came in the 880 mile and two-mile. The Paladins also won the mile relay which was uncontested when FSU's Ross Winter pulled a hamstring muscle just after taking the baton for the third leg.

Al Williams won both the shot and discus for the Seminoles. The 6-2, 240 pound senior tossed the shot 56' 5½', his best effort so far this year. Williams came closer to the 60 foot standard than any collegian in the history of the South, with his 59'10" heave in the Georgia AAUs last summer.

Floyd Lorenz won the high jump for the second straight Saturday, and edged teammate Darryl Guthrie in the 120 high hurdles. Guthrie was another double winner with firsts in the javelin and triple jump.

Curt Hallifield won both the mile and two-mile for the Paladins. Dick Irby of Furman won the 880.

A 15 mph wind aided Al Caton to a 9.5 time in the 100 yard dash-as FSU swept that event. The Seminoles also took all three places in the high hurdles, the broad jump and triple jump. Jerry McDaniel, FSU's leading point producer in the Miami meet, seemed likely to equal his feat yesterday when he won the 440, and ran on the 440 relay team. However, the Tallahassee junior was scratched in the 220, and never got a chance to bring home the baton in the mile relay because of Winter's injury."
