

Tennessee's powerful team scored points in almost every event to take their second straight SEC title.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — The Florida State track team came through with two clutch performances Saturday night to tie Northeast Louisiana for first in the independent division of the Southeastern Conference meet. With two events remaining, the Tribe of Coach Mike Long trailed NE Louisiana 24-29. The quartet of Doug Ferry, Steve Landis, Al Cato, and Jerry McDaniel won the mile relay

and Fred Lorenze set a meet record with a 6-7 high jump to give the Seminoles the draft-in lock.

The foursome of Irv Watson, John Brogle, Bill Nelson and Ross Winter won the two-mile relay for another FSU first. Sid Gainey of FSU also picked up a blue ribbon for his 23-1' leap in the broad jump.

Other Seminoles finishing in the money were Al Cato (third in 60 - yard dash), Jerry McDaniel (second in 600 - yard run), David Braggins (second in shotput and pole vault) and Ross Winter (second in 100-yard run) and Tom Graham (second in two - mile run).

The Florida State freshmen snared the frosh division behind the firsts of Wayne Currie (600-yard run), Tom Gardner (shotput), Dick Risher (mile) and the mile - relay contingent of John Odgen, Rudy Hubbard, Fred Dietrich and Wayne Currie.
