

Florida State showed Furman some rather muddy heels as Coach Mike Long's Seminoles swept to their second dual meet victory of the season, 96-49.

The weather had no adverse effect on Jerry McDaniel, Steve Landis or Don Casteel. All turned in record-breaking performances in the victory which ran FSU's winning string to ten straight. The last time the Seminoles were beaten in a dual meet was in 1963 by this same Furman team.

McDaniel and teammate Bob Sable got the Seminoles off to a shaky start when they fumbled the exchange in the 440 relay, however, the Tallahassee senior came back for his dual victories in the 230, 440 and anchored the winning mile relay team. McDaniel set a track record in the 230, most records in both events.

Landis won both the high and intermediate hurdles, setting a meet, track and school record in the intermediates with a time of 37.6.

Casteel, brother of former FSU track great Jim Casteel, won the triple jump soaring 47'3" for a new meet, track and school record. The triple jump was one of two events the Seminoles swept. Kenny White and Al Cato backed up McDaniel in the 230 to give FSU all three places in that event.

Another double winner for Florida State was weight man Ray Hoxit who won both the shot put and the discus. David Braggins took second in both events.

Furman won the first two events — the relay by grace of FSU's baton drop, and the mile on a strong finish by Curt Helfield. However, by the time results from field events started coming in, the Seminoles had built a comfortable lead and were never in danger.

As expected Furman showed strength in the distance events, but John Brogle and Ross Win-

ter were a surprise one-two finish for Florida State in the 800. Winter set the pace with Furman's Ed West with Brogle making his move from deep in the pack on the final curve.

Other Florida State winners were Darryl Guthrie in the javelin and Ed Gainer in the pole vault.

An outstanding contest in the high jump saw Furman's Frank Sailer outjump Floyd Lorenz with a leap of 6'3", a track record.

Florida State's freshman lost, 9-3, in a meet which went down to the final event -- the mile

relay. FSU had firsts in the relay, high hurdles, low hurdles, pole vault, high jump, shot put, javelin and discus.

Ed Manning won the high jump and javelin. Florio Fur both hurdle events, and J. Thompson cleared 12' 6" in the pole vault.

Herb Stein of Furman was one man gang, winning four individual events and running leg on the winning mile relay team. Stein won the 100, 200, broad and triple jump at Furman track, accounting four of the winning six points.
