In his hip pocket, Florida State track coach Mike **[-]** Long has two airplane tickets to Detroit, Mich., scene of the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships next month.

Getting those plane tickets was the first thing Long did upon returning from the Coliseum Relays in Montgomery, Ala., where the Seminoles won the Independent Divjsion championship with 33 points last weekend.

The tickets will be used by Long and broad jumper Sid Gainey, whose leap of 24'5" set a new FSU, meet and Montgomery Coliseum record, and resulted in Gaincy being chosen as the meet's outstanding performer in the independent category.

Gainey, a junior from Cairo, now has three major relay victories to his credit, and the indoor season is just reaching its peak. His Montgomery jump bettered-his FSU and Florida Relays record by four inches. Gainey also won the Orange Bowl and Senior Bowl meets this year.

"There may be a better collegiate jumper at this slage of the season," says Long, "But if there is, I have not heard of him."
