

The University of Florida, displaying great depth especially in the field events, successfully defended its title in the second annual Gulf Coast Five-Way Track Meet last night on the Florida State track here.

Florida finished with a total of 62 points, nine better than second place Florida State with 53. Alabama, with a sweep of the sprints, was third with 39 points, while Auburn finished fourth with 28 and Mississippi State was last with five.

Each of the first three teams captured five first places, but the Gators managed to take 18 places in the second third and fourth spots, against 13 for the Seminoles and eight for the Crimson Tide, to win.

Florida was led by double wins by John Morton. He set a meet record in the shot put with a throw of 55' 1½", and a meet and track record with a toss of 175' 6" in the discus.

Highlight of the Florida efforts, however, and one of the high points of the meet, was Ron Jourdon's meet and track record high jump effort of 7 feet ¾ inch.

The second place Seminoles were paced by a double win in the long and triple jumps by Phil Parker. His winning leaps were 23-feet in the long jump and 46-7 in the triple.

The Seminoles also captured both hurdle events. Mike Kelly won the high's with a time of :14.35, while Charlie Vickers held off all challengers in the 440-intermediate hurdles with a meet record time of :52.40. He just barely edged Kelly in that one — the latter clocked in 52.45.

The fifth Seminole first came in the Mike Relay where the team of George Griffin, Randy Stow, Greg Kauffman and Mike Link came across with a winning effort.

Stow ran the best leg of the relay, bringing the Seminoles from third place to first by a five yard margin.

Alabama's Dickie Chandler, and David Adkins left all other entrants vying for the runner-up places in the three dash events.

Chandler took first in the 100

and a second in the 220, while Adkins captured the 220 and the 440. Chandler's time of 9.9

seconds in the 100 tied the meet record, while Adkins :21.25 and :46.6 clockings in

the 220 and 440 respectively were good for track and meet standards.
