**MONTGOMERY** — Florida State's track team jumped into a commanding first-day lead after the first six events at the 13th annual Coliseum Relays here Friday night.

The Seminoles scored 22½ points to 11 for both East Tennessee and Georgia Tech who are tied for second. The meet winds up tonight.

David Lipscomb is fourth with seven and a half, followed by Tulane (7), Southeastern Louisiana (5) and Livingston and Brevard with 1 each.

Mike Kelly garnered the Tribe's only win, but FSU's depth carried it to the big lead. Kelly got his win in the high jump, tying a meet record at 6' 7". Seminole Jim Sauers placed fourth in the same event.

In other finals FSU's John Snyder and Chuck Crowder placed second and third in the shot. Snyder's second-place toss of 51' 11¼" was less than six inches behind winner Steve Brown of Georgia Tech.

In the long jump Steve Lewis captured second while Don Wagner placed fourth for the Tribe.

The Seminoles' ace distance man, Ken Misner, pushed David Lipscomb's Andy Russell for 19½ laps in the two-mile before the Coliseum relay record-holder pulled away for a 20-yard victory.

Florida State's Bill Jackson placed third in the pole vault, clearing 14 feet for the first time this season.

The Seminoles' two-mile relay team was second to East Tennessee in Friday night's last event.

In qualifying events Friday, the Seminoles placed two men in the finals of five of the six races to be run tonight.

Randy Stow and Greg Kaufman qualified in the quarter-mile as each placed second in his heat. The 600-yard dash will have Seminoles Steve Oulman and Hugh Illsley among the six finalists. Surprisingly Mike Link, who ran the best time of the three Seminole participants with a 1:13.8 clocking, failed to qualify in his heat. He placed third when only the first two finishers were selected for the finals.

Doug Brown and Steve Lewis qualified in both preliminary and semifinal heats in the 60-yard dash. FSU's top sprinter, Andy Guy, fell victim in his preliminary heat.

Coliseum half-mile record holder Joe Law placed second and qualified in his specialty

and was joined by Bob Courter. Law, running with a pulled leg muscle, led his heat for all but the last 10 yards.

In the 100-yard run Bob Thomas and Tom Rickards gained places for the finals for FSU. The sixth final to be run

tonight, the high-hurdles, will have Seminole Mike Kelly as its top seed.

The SEC Indoor Championships, which are also being held here, have had finals in only two events, the two-mile and the long jump.

MONTGOMERY — Paced by senior captain Mike Kelly named the meet's outstanding performer, Florida State captured an easy victory in the Coliseum relays Saturday night.

It was the second straight year that both FSU and Tennessee won the meet titles here.

Kelly, who won the high jump Friday night, also captured the 60-yard high hurdles and ran a leg of the record-setting mile-relay team Saturday to win the coveted outstanding athlete award in the independent division.

The Seminoles tallied 54½ points, better than twice the total of second-place Tulane

finished third with 23½, followed by East Tennessee with 19, and Georgia Tech 15.

In the Southeastern Conference championships, Tennessee's powerful squad ran away from Florida and the rest of the league to capture its sixth straight championship.

The Vols scored a whopping 111 points to Florida's 55. LSU was third with 22.

Florida State placed in all but one of the non-conference division finals. Only in the 440 were the Seminoles shut out.

Bob Thomas, FSU's defending meet champion in the 1000 yards run, successfully recaptured his event with a 2:14.6 pace. Thomas also ran a leg of Friday's two-mile relay team which finished second.

Triple jump specialist Phil Parker won his event with a leap of 47' 1½" for the only other Tribe first place finish. The victorious mile-relay squad, which set a new coliseum meet record with a 3:20.8 time, was manned by Greg Kaufman, Randy Stow, Mike Link and Kelly.

Florida State's Joe Law, running with a pulled muscle, was not able to successfully defend his 880 title, but did place third after putting on a strong finishing kick.

In the mile run Seminole Ken Misner placed second to David Lipscomb's Andy Russell. It was the second 1-2 finish for this pair of distance runners, with the two placing in the same order in the two-mile event Friday.
