

Mike Kelly, Florida State's all-around track performer, was voted the outstanding athlete last weekend during the 12th annual Furman News-Piedmont Relays in Greenville, S.C.

The Seminole star captured two first places, claimed a second and anchored his team's mile relay team.

Kelly, a senior from Winter Park, copped the high jump with a 6-foot-6-inch leap and won the intermediate hurdles in a meet record time of 52.3.

In the 120-yard high hurdles, Kelly finished second to Duke's Jeff Howser. The Blue Devil star was clocked at 13.8 to Kelly's 14.2.

The Seminoles also had another winner as sophomore John Snyder tossed the shot put 52 feet, 5 inches.

Tribe distance runner Ken Misner broke the school two-mile record with a 9:01 clocking. However, this was only good for third place.

While there is no official team winner declared, the Seminoles would have been kings had the meet been scored on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis. On that basis, Florida State would have recorded 45 points to its nearest foe, Yale, at 28.

Other Seminoles who finished among the top five included Phil Parker (4th in

long jump, 22-4), two-mile relay team (2nd), Parker (2nd in triple jump, 47-2 1/2), Charlie Galloway (3rd in triple jump, 46-6), Jim Sauers (4th in high jump, 6-4), Bill Jackson (2nd in pole vault, 14-0) and spring medley relay team (3rd).

Coach Mike Long called his team's performance "the best competitive effort I've had in several years."
