GAINESVILLE (AP) — Florida's magie 7 - foot h i g h jumper, Ron Jourdan, and Miami Jackson High School's Amos Machanic took top honors in the 26th annual Florida Relays Saturday.

Jourdan, who has cleared the seven-foot barrier 16 out of 18 attempts this season, captured the top award in the university class as he swept to a meet record of seven-feet even in the high jump. Along with the record, he received the Kerney-Rayburn Memorial Trophy for the outstanding collegiate athtete in the meet.

Jourdan's attempt at seven feet 2¹/₂ inches failed.

Machanic, a senior at Miami Jackson, led his teammates to a new record in the two-mile relay with a half mile anchor of 1:52.7. He later ran the fastest prep 440 ever run in Florida as he toured the track in 47.8. He was named the outstanding high school athlete of the meet.

Florida A&M's 440-yard relay team of Richard Corbett, Hubert Ginn, Richard Reed and Otis Hill won that event with a time of 40.9 seconds, while Florida State was second.

FSU's Mike Kelly took accouple of seconds, in the 440yard intermediate hurdles (:52.3) and the 120-yard high hurdles (:14.1).

The Tribe's hurdle shuttle relay team was third, while Phil Parker of FSU was third in the triple jump, Ken Misner was fourth in the two-mile, Charles Galloway fifth in the triple jump and the FSU twomile relay team finished fifth.

During the afternoon, six university class records and five high school marks were set. Miami Jackson's victory in the two-mile relay began the assault on the record books and Tennessee ended the afternoon with a record 3:8.1 in the mile relay.

Largo's Barney Hess thrilled the crowd with a record setting jump of 14 feet, 8 inches in the high school pole vault. Dell Ramers, a senior at Dunnedin High School, set a new record of 4:15.7 in the prep mile.
