

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) — Tennessee's domination of indoor track and field competition in the Southeastern Conference has carried through another season following the Vols' easy victory in the conference meet here Saturday night.

Tennessee swept seven first places in the 15 events and coasted to its seventh straight SEC indoor crown. Meanwhile, Florida State pulled away from Georgia Tech to win the 14th annual Coliseum Indoor meet run in conjunction with the SEC meet.

The Vols had 92½ points fol-

lowed by Florida at 52½, Kentucky 33, Auburn 21, Louisiana State 17, Alabama 9, and Georgia, Mississippi and Mississippi State 4 each.

The Seminoles successfully defended their Coliseum Indoor crown with 61 points. Georgia Tech had 37 points, Livingston, Ala., State 24, East Tennessee 18½, Arkansas State and Tulane 15 each, Brevard 11 and Florida Junior College 10½.

Florida's Ron Coleman was named the outstanding competitor in the SEC meet after winning two events—the triple jump with a leap of 49 feet, 11½ inches and the long jump at 24-8½.

The outstanding individual honors in the independent phase went to Arkansas State's Thomas Hill who won the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.3 seconds, one-tenth of a second slower than the meet record he set in Friday's trials.

John Stuart of Kentucky set a record in the shot put with a heave of 57-8½, bettering the mark of 57-5½ set two years ago by Tennessee's Chip Kell, who finished second Saturday night.
