

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) — Fourteen track records were set and one tied here Saturday at the dedication meet of Auburn's new track facility in honor of Wilbur Hutsell. Georgia Tech pulled away in the final events to win the first annual meet with 66 points.

Finishing second was Tennessee with 46½ points closely followed by Florida with 46. Host Auburn finished with 41 for a fourth.

The honors ceremonies for Hutsell, who has been associated with Auburn track programs since 1921, was directed by Auburn president Dr. Harry Philpott. During his career with the Tigers, Hutsell amassed a dual meet record of 140 wins and 25 losses.

Many of Hutsell's former athletes were on hand for the ceremonies.

Florida jumped out in front early with one-two finishes in the long and triple jumps, but lost out in the closing rush by the Yellow Jackets and Vols.

Many of the Tennessee stars were absent from the meet because they were participating in the California Relays.

—120-yard high hurdles, Steve Richards of Auburn and Tom Malik of Furman, 14.5 in the preliminaries; 440-yard intermediate hurdles, Alvin Bresler of Auburn, 51.7; mile relay by Tennessee, 3:14.1.

—Pole vault, Bill Jackson of Florida, 15.0; high jump, Terry Muirhead of Georgia Tech, 6-7; shot put, Jim Nelson of Florida, 57-3¾; discus, Tom Carmichael of Tennessee, 170-6; havelin, Jim Stites of Florida, 226-0.

Tennessee's 440-relay team tied the track record with a 41.2 performance.

The only events in which records were not tied or set were the long jump and the triple jump.
