

Seminole Trackmen Break School Marks in 5 Events

JACKSON, Miss. - Florida State's track team set five new school records here Saturday in the U.S. Track and Field Federation Southern Indoor Championships.

Seminoles Allen McMillan and Danny Smith qualified for the NCAA Indoor championships in March.

McMillan won the pole vault with a jump of 16-1 ³/₄. Smith captured the 60-yard high hurdles in the preliminaries with a 7.1 clocking, and this tied the meet record. Both victories set Florida State indoor records.

Other school marks were established by Osborn Brown in the shot put, Tyrone Frederick in the 880 and the mile relay team.

Brown had a toss of 56-2 ³/₄ to place second. The 280-pounder, who transferred from Florida Junior College, was the national junior college champ last year.

Frederick won the 880 in 1:53.8, a new meet mark. He

also ran with the mile relay group which won its heat in 3:19.0. Robin McEachin, Steve Adams and Joel Garren compose the remainder on the team, third in the finals.

Freshman Bobby James was second in the mile with a

4:14.7, a personal best.

Ken Misner, a trackman for Florida State two years ago, was named the meet's outstanding athlete. Misner was competing for the Air Force and set a new meet record in the two mile with an 8:50.6.
