

Smith's Hurdles Victory Typifies FSU Performance

Danny Smith's victory in the 120-yard high hurdles here Saturday typified Florida State's performance in the college division of the Kiwanis Invitational Track and Field meet.

Smith, the co-world record holder of the 80-yard highs, breezed to a 14.2 and set the pace for the Seminoles who finished with wins in 11 of the 14 events.

The college division of the annual meet, which also had two high school divisions, was non-scored.

Leading from the start, Smith beat his nearest competitor by a good five yards. The

superhurdler's accomplishments during the past indoor season made the 120 highs one of the key events in the invitational. And he was one of several highlights in an impressive Seminole show of strength.

Osburn Brown, the 280-pound national junior college shot put champion, was a double winner for Florida State. He took the shot with a heave of 53-10 and the discus with a throw of 145-8.

Randy Hutchinson tossed the javelin 235-1 to qualify for the NCAA Outdoor Championships later this year. Hutchinson finished second to Skip Cum-

tings of Dartmouth who had an outstanding throw of 245 feet, pushing him far past the qualifying mark for the NCAA.

Jeff Nedemeyer, a Seminole freshman, equaled his career best in the high jump with a leap of 6-10. His first jump to that height came in the recent Florida A&M Relays where he qualified for the NCAA meet.

Florida State won three of the four relays. The two mile relay team, composed of Bob Fleming, Robin McEachin, Wes Koenig and Tyrone Frederick, posted a 744.2.

The 440 relay squad had a 42.6.
