UCLA Leads NCAA Track

Milburn Sets Record

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) World record holder Rodney Milburn of Southern University smashed the National Collegiate Athletic Association standard in the 120-yard high hurdles Friday night in 13.1 seconds.

Milburn, whose world mark is 13 seconds flat, left an elite field approaching the final hurdles and won going away by three-tenths of a second over runnerup Charles Foster of North Carolina Central.

Another record fell early in the second night of competition in the 52nd NCAA Track and Field Championships when Middle Tennessee's Barry McClure soared to 54-1 1/4 in his first attempt in triple jump qualifying.

Milburn's time broke the old NCAA mark of 13.2 set by Erv Hall of Villanova in 1969.

McClure's effort erased the triple jump record of 53.7 1/4 set two years ago by Denny Rogers of UCLA.

UCLA, favored to win its third straight championship, held a slight lead over Texas-EI Paso after six finals in the 21-event meet. The powerful Bruins had 26 points, UTEP had 18.

Trailing them was Kent State with 14 points.

Trailing them was Brigham Young with 15 points, followed by Kent State with 14, Penn State and Cincinnati with 12 each, and Oregon, Connecticut, Southern Louisiana and Memphis State with 10 each.

Ed Hammonds of Memphis State captured the 100-yard dash championship in a photo finish as the top six sprinters hit the tape in 9.4 seconds. Steve Riddick, the college division champion from Norfolk State, was second and Carl Lawson of Idaho State third.

One of the favorites, Olym-

pic gold medalist Gerald Tinker of Kent State, finished fourth in the 100, while another star, Southern California's Donald Quarrie, failed to place, finishing seventh. Last year's 200-meters king, Larry Burton of Purdue, was sixth.

Norwegian Olympian Finn Bendixen of UCLA captured the long jump title on his last jump of the day, going 25-10 1/2. It lifted him past Cincinnati's Al Lanier, who had a 25-7 1/2 to finish second for the second straight year. He also was the indoor runnerup, losing his

lead in each case on the final jump.

Football star James McAlister of UCLA equalled Lanier's distance, but took third place because Lanier's second-best distance was better. Defending champion Randy Williams of Southern California was fourth.

The hammer title went to Jacques Accambray of Kent State with a throw of 221-6, edging Pete Farmer of Texas-EI Paso with a 220-5.

Another Texas-EI Paso strongman, Hans Hogland, won the shotput at 64-6 1/4, beating Western Kentucky's Jesse Stuart by almost four inches.

Charles Magire of Penn State captured the grueling six mile run in the humid weather conditions at 28:19.3. He made his move 500 yards from the finish and ran the final mile in 4:31.2. The runnerup was Pat Madera of Indiana, who had a 28:20, closing fast to pass Brigham Young's Mitch Wiley at the finish line.

UCLA Wins NCAA Track Title

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) Oregon's Steve Prefontaine captured his fourth straight three-mile championship in record time, UCLA won the tejam title and eight runners broke the four minute mark in the mile run Saturday during the 52nd annual National Collegiate Athletic Association track and field championships.

Prefontaine, running virtually alone in the latter stages of the race, covered the three-mile distance in 13:05.3 despite sweltering 90 degree temperatures at the Louisiana State University track stadium.

His time broke his own record of 13:20.1 set two years ago.

Defending champion Dave Wottle of Bowling Green captured the mile run in 3:57.1, running the final quarter in 53 seconds to smash the meet record of 3:57.4 set by Villanova's Marty Liquori, a three-time champion in 1971.

Wottle appeared to coast down the final stretch, looking over both shoulders, at a pair of North Carolina runners who finished second and third, Tony Waldrop who had 3:57.3 and Reggie McAfee, who had 3:57.8.

Hailu Ebbs of Oregon State was also timed in 3:57.8. Michigan State's Ken Popejoy, 3:58.5, and San Jose State's Mark Schilling, 3:58.6. Two runners failed to score points despite running under four minutes. They were Knut Kvalheim of Oregon in 3:58.9 and Charles McFullen of Missouri, in 3:59.6.

Four other NCAA records fell.

Doug Brown of Tennessee, one of 10 children, broke the record in the 3,000 meter steeplechase in 8:28.1, winning by almost 20 seconds. The old record of 8:30.1 was set last

year by Joe Lucas of Georgetown.

Sam Colson of Kansas hurled the javelin 279-9, erasing the 273-3 standard set by Tennessee's Bill Skinner in 1968.

Milan Tiff of UCLA soared to a 54-7 3/4ths in the triple jump to capture that event and break the record set by runner-up Barry McClure of Middle Tennessee. McClure had broken the record in Friday night's trials at 54-1 1/4ths.

The other record fell in the high jump where 1971 champion Reynaldo Brown of California Poly-San Luis Obispo cleared 74. Last year's champ,

Tom Woods of Oregon, who held the mark at 7-3 3/4ths, also cleared 74.

UCLA wrapped up its third straight team title before its mile relay team captured that event for the fifth straight year. The Bruin quartet of Ron Gaddis, Gordon Peppers, Maxie Parks and Benny Brown, clocked a 3:04.3, seven-tenths of a second ahead of both Texas and Arizona State.

UCLA piled up 56 points, followed by Oregon with 31, Brigham Young and Arizona State with 26 each, and Tennessee, 21.

Florida State had nine athletes qualify for the NCAA Track and Field Championships held in Baton Rouge on June 5-9 (FSU Track Office Files, 5-9 June 1973). This was the largest number of athletes FSU had ever sent to a national track and field meet in the history of the school.

The highest Seminole place was sixteenth by Charlie Harris in the triple jump. Harris leaped 50' 1/2", only one inch off his career best.

Danny Smith was the main Tribe hope for a high national finish. The FSU hurdler broke the Louisiana State University track record with a :13.5 clocking in his preliminary heat. His record stood for five minutes as Rodney Milburn burned a :13.4 in the very next race. The semifinal race proved fatal to Smith's chances for victory. Despite being in position to qualify easily for the finals, Smith began to press in an attempt to hold off a charge being mounted by North Carolina Central's Charles Foster. In the process, Smith clipped the eighth hurdle and hit the ninth barrier knocking himself out of the race (Long, C. M., 1976).

Tyrone Frederick was improving rapidly yet needed a break in the draw of his preliminary heat for an outside chance to place (Long, L. S., 1976). Unfortunately, he drew a strong heat as four men came charging out of the last curve in a pack. With only three runners qualifying for the finals, Frederick finished fourth with a time of 1:49.5 (Long, C. M., 1976).

Jeff Nedimyer and Allen McMillen failed to qualify for the final in the high jump and pole vault with jumps of 6' 6" and 15' 6", respectively. Jumping 23' 11-1/2" in the long jump, Rudy Falana did not progress to the finals. Randy Hutchinson had hoped to find one good throw in his ailing arm to earn his way into the finals. The gutty junior was unable to do so, but managed to throw a very respectable 220' 5". Bob Brooks found the three-mile field very tough.

When the pace quickened during the middle stages of the third mile, Brooks was unable to stay with the leaders finishing twelfth in his heat with a time of 14:04.8.
