

Preview for the
1981 NATIONAL COLLEGIATE OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Even if Suleiman Nyambui does not double, the University of Texas-El Paso looks like a good bet to defend its title. If the Miners of Ted Banks do win it, it will be their third title in a row, a feat previously accomplished only by Southern Cal (which had strings of nine and seven) and UCLA.

As always, the Miners can be expected to come to a strong peak at this meet, as Banks is rather adept at getting the most out of his athletes at the nationals.

If anybody is to replace UTEP at the top this year, it looks like its clone, Southern Methodist. SMU head coach Ted McLaughlin learned his lessons well as an assistant at UTEP, and is bringing new "nationals consciousness" to the South-west Conference.

SMU does seem to be very close to maximum potential, however, so UTEP will have to come back to them if the Mustangs are to pull an upset. In the absence of this scenario, the order of their indoor finish will be duplicated.

With its incredible collection of sprinters, Arizona State could conceivably raise its point total considerably, but it is always dangerous to plan on too many points coming from the tender legs of dashmen.

UCLA (which coincidentally won the final leg of its triple crown at the last edition of this meet in Baton Rouge, 1973) and Oregon should follow as the Pac-10 figures to take three of the top five places.

100-meter dash--1. Carl Lewis (Houston, soph.); 2. Mel Lattany (Georgia, sr.); 3. Calvin Smith (Alabama, soph.); 4. Eric Brown (UCLA, jr.); 5. Mike Miller (Tennessee, jr.); 6. Peter Okodogbe (Arizona, jr.).

Lewis is in the unique position of being the favorite, even though he didn't even enter the event last year. He has solidified his sprinting credentials since then, however, and he and Lattany should duplicate their Indoor 1-2.

Promising youngster Smith has tender muscles and may not hold. The other places are up for grabs, with the development of Georgia's Herschel Walker one of the year's more interesting stories.

200-meter dash--1. James Butler (Oklahoma State, jr.); 2. Dwayne Evans (Arizona State, sr.); 3. LaMonte King (Arizona State, jr.); 4. Butch Woolfolk (Michigan, jr.); 5. Efrem Coley (Louisiana State, jr.); 6. Carlton Young (Villanova, soph.).

Evans appears to be approaching his 1976 form, when he won an Olympic bronze. If he stays healthy, he might take Butler, winner of last year's Olympic Trials.

The versatile King won The Athletic Congress title last year, but he's coming off a groin pull and hasn't as yet been able to assert himself. After this, there's a notable drop in quality, as many top sprinters still avoid this event.

Cameron looks like a good bet to repeat the title he won last year, with his top opposition coming from a pair of Africans, Kenyan frosh Konchellah and 1979 winner Hassan (Sudan). Hassan could be particularly deadly if he regains his form of two years ago.

Henley reportedly dislikes this race, but could knock off the favorites.

800-meter run--1. Sammy Koskei (SMU, soph.); 2. David Mack (Oregon, soph.); 3. James Mays (Texas Tech, sr.); 4. Agberto Guimaraes (Brigham Young, soph.); 5. Peter Lemashon (UTEP, sr.); 6. Richard Ouma (Fairleigh Dickinson, soph.).

Indoor winner Koskei is the event's new sensation, and a victory by him is eagerly-sought by team-hungry SMU.

Mack is the top domestic talent. A repeat of last year's blanket finish is by no means unlikely. As always, the prelims will be sheer murder.

Harbour and Spivey are easily the class of a surprisingly nondescript field, and Spivey has yet to prove that he has recovered from a winter ankle injury. Neither comes from a conference with a recent history of winners in this event. Last Big 10 winner was Warren Dreutzler (Michigan State) in 1951 and the SWC has never had one.

Draddy has some nice relay legs, while Mares emerged well at Kansas. Bitok and Cornell are currently off form.

3,000-meter steeplechase--1. John Gregorek (Georgetown, jr.); 2. Solomon Chebor (Fairleigh Dickinson, sr.); 3. Hans Koeleman (Clemson, soph.); 4. Harrison Koroso (Arizona, sr.); 5. Dave Daniels (UCLA, jr.); 6. Mike Friton (Oregon, sr.).

Gregorek rates on the top, based on last year's form--form he hasn't yet displayed in 1981. Top challenger Chebor could well end up in the 5,000 instead.

World record holder Henry Rono could be a factor if he decides to enter.

Super-kickers Maree and Padilla should blow away the field in the last lap. Padilla, who showed in his battles with Suleiman Nyambui that he can kick with the best of them, will have a new challenge in 1979 winner Maree.

Chapa was the 1978 champ and will challenge for the top if he regains his health. Other leading UTEP runners might double back here if needed on Saturday.

10,000-meter run--1. Suleiman Nyambui (UTEP, jr.); 2. Alberto Salazar (Oregon, sr.); 3. Mike Musyoki (UTEP, sr.); 4. Matthews Motshwarateu (UTEP, fr.); 5. Dave Murphy (Western Kentucky, sr.); 6. Marck Scrutton (Colorado, sr.).

Salazar is optimistic that he can build enough strength to lose the kickers before it's too late, but it's a big question mark whether anyone can develop enough power to lose defending champion Nyambui, who should disappear from the Duck on the last lap.

This race is obviously the keystone to UTEP's team hopes, with three (and maybe four) top placers, including 1978 winner Musyoki.

110-meter high hurdles--1. Orlando McDaniel (Louisiana State, jr.); 2. Rod Wilson (Villanova, soph.); 3. Willie Gault (Tennessee, soph.); 4. Terron Wright (Memphis State, sr.); 5. Anthony Hancock (Tennessee, jr.); 6. Dennis Brantley (SMU, fr.).

McDaniel, last year's runnerup, should give the home folks something to cheer about (interestingly enough, the only local winner the last time LSU hosted the meet also came in this event--Rod Milburn from across-the-river Southern U.).

Last year's Indoor winner, Wilson hasn't progressed much from there. Wright won this year's Indoor crown, but hasn't held shape that well in the past.

The race is for second, as defending champ Lee, who made the Olympic Team last year, is off better than ever.

Mulli vs. Phillips, turned the team race around last year, and the Bruin hopes to atone for his seventh, although he may be hurt by relay duties. It's still too early to tell just how the Easterners are going to develop.

400-meter relay--1. Tennessee; 2. Arizona State; 3. Houston; 4. Georgia; 5. Oklahoma State; 6. Northwestern Louisiana.

Tennessee and Arizona State both have the bonus of having a lot of interchangeable parts; Arizona State's, however, are just a bit too fragile, it seems. Give the edge to the Vols.

Anchormen Carl Lewis and Mel Lattany make Houston and Georgia forces to be reckoned with. James Butler is equally dangerous if Oklahoma State brings him in close.

1,600-meter relay--1. Seton Hall; 2. UCLA; 3. Arizona State; 4. Kansas; 5. Tennessee; 6. SMU.

The Hall has at least five tough runners and Michael Paul's 45.39 at Dogwood makes them look great. UCLA could challenge if Eric Brown leads off.

As always, the event is tough to forecast because of the multiple-event factor.

High jump--1. Leo Williams (Navy, soph.); 2. Jim Howard (Texas A&M, jr.); 3. Milt Ottey (UTEP, fr.); 4. Ken Glover (Eastern Kentucky, jr.); 5. Marvin Mays (Kentucky, jr.); 6. Greg Schaper (Arkansas State, sr.).

Williams looks like a good bet to match his Indoor win, although Olympian Howard is at his best in big competitions.

Ottey's points are important to UTEP of course. Lee Balkin of UCLA would be among the top six, but has been bothered by mononucleosis.

Pole vault--1. Randy Hall (Texas A&M, sr.); 2. Dave Volz (Indiana, fr.); 3. Anthony Curran (UCAL, jr.); 4. Ed Langford (Purdue, sr.); 5. Felix Bohni (San Jose State, soph.); 6. Randy Raymond (Nebraska, sr.).

The veteran Hall vaults best in the late season, but his title defense looks likely to get a sharp attack from new sensation Volz, who has picked up outdoors where he left off undercover.

The consistent Curran has been over 17-feet in his first six outdoor meets and rates ahead of Indoor champ Langford, another big-meet competitor.

Lewis can (and likely will) become the all-time NCAA long jump title champion when he takes this one for No. 4 (2 indoors, 2 outdoors), as King can't handle double duty quite as well.

Artis, the latest in a long line of fine Middle Tennessee horizontal jumpers, is a crack big-meet competitor. Simmons looks great of early-season marks, and McCain should be tough at home.

Triple jump--1. Keith Connor (SMU, soph.); 2. Ian Campbell (Washington State, sr.); 3. Dokie Williams (UCLA, jr.); 4. Steve Hanna (UTEP, sr.); 5. Sanya Owolabi (Kansas, jr.); 6. Joseph Taiwo (Washington State, soph.).

Connor doesn't jump often (bad heels), but when he does, he's one of the world's best, as indicated by his World Record to win the Indoor this year. He's not much ahead of Campbell, whom he beat by a single place in last year's Olympics (4th and 5th).

Competition like this is why defending champ Hanna looks like a fourth at the moment. It might take 55 feet to get in the top five.

The Indoor got Carter his first 69-footer (skipping right past 68), and the Outdoor could well be what's needed to make him the fifth collegiate 70-footer.

Behind him comes the intriguing new crop of collegiate talent, with Lehmann the longest tosser but Maciejczyk having the homecourt advantage.

Discus--1. Goran Svensson (Brigham Young, jr.); 2. Dean Crouser (Oregon, soph.); 3. Dave Porath (California, jr.); 4. Carlos Scott (UTEP, jr.); 5. Pat McCulla (Kentucky, jr.); 6. Richard Slaney (San Diego State, jr.).

Crouser scored a personal best (at LSU, interestingly enough) in an early-season win against Svensson, but the BYU Swede, the defending champion, is a good peak-season performer.

Scott will likely be hard pressed to match last year's surprise runnerup performance. Porath is the latest member of the 200-foot club.

An SMU production, and as important to the Mustangs as the 10,000 is to UTEP. Olsen and Weir will fight it out at Collegiate Record-lengths, while Hoff will pick up place points and Keith Bateson will fight hard to do so.

Bateson will also engage Thomson and Bill Green of Long Beach in an interesting battle for American supremacy.

Lorentzen, twice a favorite and twice a bust, is up for his last try, but currently rates only No. 2 in the state behind newly-consistent Wolf.

As always, the form chart will be blown more in this event than any other.

Defending champion Anderson, much healthier than last year, could well challenge the Collegiate Record (8,124 points) held by Steiner. Steiner, the 1977 and 1979 winner, is finally healthy again and should also challenge 8,000 points.

The top new face belongs to Irvine, in obscurity since winning the AAU Junior title in 1979.

Texas-El Paso rolls to another championship

Texas-El Paso put together a string of five individual titles to capture its second straight National Collegiate Outdoor Track Championship.

Paced by the double win of Suleiman Nyambui in the 5,000 meters (13:44.43) and the 10,000 meters (29:21.85), the Miners scored 69 points to UCLA's 46. Florida State was third with 38. Southern Cal had 36 and Villanova finished with 26. The championships were conducted June 3-7 at the University of Texas, Austin.

The other individual winners for the Miners were Thommie Sjöholm in the hammer throw (225-0), Bert Cameron in the 400 meters (45.23) and Steve Hanna in the triple jump (55-1).

Texas-El Paso became only the fourth team to win five individual championships in one year. The last time any team won as many as five was 1953 when Southern California won six.

Two meet records were established, both in

jumping events. Jeff Woodard of Alabama broke Dwight Stones' meet high jump record and tied his American record with his mark of 7-7 $\frac{1}{2}$. Randy Hall of Texas A&M broke the NCAA meet record in the pole vault with an 18-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ showing.

Houston's Carl Lewis produced the meet's best winning leap ever in the long jump (27-4 $\frac{1}{2}$), but the effort was wind-aided and will not stand as a record.

UCLA was the only other team with more than one individual championship. Greg Foster regained his title in the 110-meter high hurdles (13.42), and Mark Anderson won the decathlon (7893).

In addition to Nyambui, the only other individual to defend his championship successfully was Villanova's Don Paige in the 800 meters (1:45.81). Southern Cal repeated as the winning team in the 400-meter relay.

1981 NCAA TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS
Bernie Moore Stadium - Louisiana State University
June 2-6

- RETURN TO BATON ROUGE:** LSU hosts the NCAA Track and Field Championships for the second time in eight years. The first championships meet held in Baton Rouge was in 1973, the year of the monsoon, when UCLA won its fifth team title. This marks only the third time in history an SEC school has hosted the event. The Tigers have done it twice, while Tennessee played host in 1969.
- THE TRACK:** The Bernie Moore Track has a new look this year. It was converted to meters and a new Chevron surface was installed in the fall of 1980. Other minor changes include the re-location of the high jump to the north end of the infield.
- The stadium seats 5,680 and is the home of the annual LSU Invitational Track Meet. Five conference championships have been held at the site, and the boy's and girl's high school state track championships are held in Bernie Moore Stadium each year. As to the future, the 1983 Special Olympics will be staged at the facility.
- THE RECORDS:** During the 1973 national championships almost every stadium record was set. Only two running events survived, the 100 and 200. The current records are metric standards and no conversions have been used. Four individual competitors in this meet hold Bernie Moore Stadium records: Agberto Guimaraes of Brigham Young (1:46.76 in 800-meters); Jim Stinzi of Wisconsin (13:37.73 in 5,000-meters); Mike Carter of SMU (66-1 3/4 shot put); and Dean Crouser of Oregon (205-11 discus).
- THE FAVORITES:** The University of Texas - El Paso seems to be the team to beat again this year as the Miners seek their third consecutive title. However, SMU could give UTEP a battle, along with Arizona State, UCLA, and Oregon. If UTEP wins, the Miners will equal a feat previously accomplished only by Southern California and UCLA. Coincidentally, UCLA won their third in a row on the LSU track in 1973.
- Only seven schools have won more than a single title in NCAA history. Southern California took 27 of the 59 previous championships followed by Illinois with 5, UCLA 5, Oregon 4, Kansas 3, Stanford 3, and UT-EL Paso 3.
- QUALIFIERS:** The schools with the most athletes qualified for the 1981 NCAA championships, prior to final declarations, are: Arizona State 16, UT-EL-Paso 15, Tennessee 15, SMU 13, Oregon 13, Washington State 11, and UCLA 11.
- LSU IN THE NCAA:** LSU has only one national championship to its credit, that coming in 1933 under coach Bernie Moore. The most recent individual title was won by the 1600-meter relay team in 1979, while Larry Shipp won the high hurdles in 1975. The Tigers have had a total of 12 national outdoor champions.
- TELEVISION:** The 1981 NCAA championships will be televised by ABC with Keith Jackson, Marty Liquori and Bill Flemming handling the announcing chores. The broadcast will be aired Sunday afternoon, June 7.

ENTRIES: This year there are returning champions in 12 of the 21 NCAA events. Prior to Wednesday's final declaration meeting, the 1981 NCAA meet had 507 entries representing 109 schools.

Each horizontal line of this metric pace chart indicates the elapsed time for various distances when covering ground at an even pace. For instance, 66 seconds for each 400-meters will produce 1500-meters in 4:07.5 or 3000-meters in 8:15.0. From the same line you can determine that if 1000-meters is reached in 2:45.0 and the pace is maintained, the 5000 time will be 13:45.0.

PRESS BOX SEATING: The press box is located on the WEST SIDE of the Bernie Moore Track Stadium. Your working press credential will be numbered and this number corresponds to your seat number in the press box. Seats are numbered from 1 through 121 (SOUTH TO NORTH) with the smaller numbers on your left and the larger numbers on your right as you face the press box (to enter it) from the track side (numbers 1-54 are located in the SOUTH PRESS SECTION, 55-69 in the CONTROL CENTER AND 70-121 in the NORTH PRESS SECTION). Entrance to seats 1-23 will be through the gate at the south of Section U-12; for seats 37-54 at the north end of U-14; seats 71-121 either of two gates: the south end of U-16 or the north end of U-18.

RESULTS: Comprehensive summary sheets will be distributed after each heat, trials and finals. There will be individual sheets for each one. To aid you in keeping track of the various sheets, a color code will be used:

<u>Canary</u>	All decathlon events
<u>Blue</u>	All trials & prelims
<u>Green</u>	All semi's
<u>White</u>	All finals
<u>Pink</u>	All quotes

Results WILL NOT be re-run at the end of each day's action. We ask your cooperation by retaining all materials passed out during the competition.

In addition to the individual sheets, there will be a summary sheet for anyone desiring a gate. This will be available at different times during each day.

PRESS RESTRICTIONS: All writers are limited to the press box and/or the interview area. Quotes will be distributed in the press box. Photographers are the only news media representatives allowed on the field, however, for running event finishes, they must remain on the WEST SIDE and SOUTH of the finish line -- This restriction is necessary to allow finish judges an unobstructed view of the track and the finish line.

TELEPHONES: Unless you have ordered a phone, there are no phones available on press row, other than the LSU Sports Information Department phone which is for emergency use only. The press box and the LSU Sports Information Department phone number is: 388-8226. LSU Track Office: 388-8627. Ticket Office: 388-2184. Press Room: 388-8250. Paul Manasseh (home): 769-0164. Larry White (home): 344-4378. Snookie Newman (home): 766-1861.

MEDIA WORK ROOM: A Media Work Room is located in the Southwest Corridor of the Assembly Center. This entrance is located near the Tiger Cage. It will be open throughout the meet. Tables and chairs are situated there and a total of five telephones will be operational and available on a first come basis.

SHUTTLE SERVICE: A shuttle service will be provided between the press headquarters, the Hilton Hotel, and the LSU campus. Anyone wishing to avail themselves of this service may board shuttle vans at the lobby entrance of the Hilton. The shuttles will begin service at the following times:

WEDNESDAY: Noon
THURSDAY: 10:30 a.m.
FRIDAY: 2:30 p.m.
SATURDAY: 1:30 p.m.

Service will take passengers to the "L" Club room (the press hospitality room). When the events start, service will conduct passengers directly to Bernie Moore Track Stadium. After the meet has concluded for the day, the shuttles will depart from the main entrance of the stadium 30 minutes after the final event. The shuttles will continue to run after the meet, but will depart from the "L" Club Room late in the evening.

INTERVIEW AREA: An interview area has been established behind the Southwest stands in the Press Tent (within the enclosed fence area of the track). To reach this area, leave the press box and descend to the ground level -- then, prior to exiting through the main gates, turn left (south) and head toward the fenced area. Enter the gate at that point and the interview tent will be straight ahead. We will plan to bring all placers into the tent for interviews following each event. Special interview requests should be directed to Paul Manasseh, Larry White, Snookie Newman or Gerry Poche in the Control Center. In addition, a special telephone line has been installed linking the interview tent with the Control Center and quotes will be transcribed for later distribution to all media. There is one other place where interviews may be done. This would be in the Field House, due north of the track stadium. Participants will assemble there before each event begins. There will also be exhibits and clinics conducted in that structure. Your credential will permit you access to the building. You should descend to the ground level, go out of the main gates and turn to your right(north). Proceed to the Southwest Portal entrance to the Field House and enter the building at that point.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM: The chief announcer for the meet will be Bob Steiner, assisted by Mike Boyer and Sid Crocker.

TELECOPIERS: There is a Telecopier Service available at a charge of \$20 per three pages of copy. LSU Sports Information also has a TI Silent 700 available on a first come basis at no charge. Inquiries into these services should be directed at any Sports Information personnel.

REFRESHMENTS: Soft drinks will be available in the press box throughout the meet. However, because of the limited facilities, no food will be distributed in the press box. However, coffee, doughnuts, Danish, chips and dips will be available in the Hospitality Room in the L Club Room in the Assembly Center during its hours of operation. Additionally, liquid refreshment will be available and a buffet meal will be offered during the meet.

HOSPITALITY ROOM: The Hospitality Room is located in the L Club Room of the Assembly Center. To reach this location, go to the main entrance of the Arena, but rather than go up the double stairs leading into the building, turn to your left, walk several paces until you reach the down staircase where a security officer will be on duty. He will direct you to the room by descending the stairs. NO ONE will be admitted unless that person has one of the following credentials: Working Press, Coaches, VIP, Photographers, Worker, or ABC-TV. We also ask that no food or

drink be taken out of the Hospitality Room. Hours of operation will be:

The new Varsity Tennis Courts will be available each day between the hours of 8 a.m. and noon. Please sign for these at the information desk at the Southwest Portal of the LSU Field House.

The raquetball/handball courts in the Field House also are available, but must be reserved at the information desk in the Field House. Some racquets and balls may be checked out at that point also.

OFFICE LOCATIONS: Sports Information is on the second floor of Tiger Stadium. It may be reached through the Athletic Department lobby at the northeast corner of Tiger Stadium, or through the stairs located at NS-2. This is situated between the Football Office and the Athletic Department office.
