

FSU track members qualify for relay finals

AUSTIN, Texas — Two members of Florida State University men's track and field team, competing in the trials of the Texas Relays, qualified for finals today as did the 1,600-meter relay team.

Sophomore hurdler Leander McKenzie, already an NCAA qualifier in two events, won his heat of the 110-meter high hurdles in 13.7 seconds. Dusty Harmon also qualified for the finals in the pole vault by equaling his best jump of the year, 16'6".

McKenzie also runs the leadoff leg of the relay, which won its heat in 3:09.03. In addition to McKenzie, Reggie Ross, Charlie Carr and Vince Bostic all ran 47.2 splits in the relay. The Seminoles ran in the same heat as indoor champion Oklahoma State.

McKenzie, FSU men's track team run well in Texas

The Florida State men's track team fared well in the finals of the Texas Relays on Saturday, finishing high in two events.

Leander McKenzie placed fourth in the finals of the 110-meter high hurdles with a time of 13.96.

In addition, the 1600-meter relay team of McKenzie, Reggie Ross, Charlie Carr and Vince Bostic finished third behind Southern Illinois and Texas Christian with a time of 3:05.50, FSU's fastest time this year in that event.

Dusty Harmon was in finals of the pole vault but did not place.
