

# MOBILE, Ala. (AP)—Top athletes from throughout the nation rewrote the record book in the second annual Senior Bowl Track and Field Championships.

Records were set or tied in six of the 12 events in the university and open divisions Tuesday night.

John Pennel of Miami, Fla., the only pole vaulter still active who has cleared 17-feet, bettered the old record by better than a foot.

Pennel cleared 15-1 with ease. The old record was set last year by Pete Boudreaux at 15-0 1/4. Pennel tried for a world's indoor record at 16-7, barely missing on his last two tries.

Eugene Milton of Florida A&M edged Southern University's George Anderson in the 50-yard dash and set a record doing it. Last year Anderson set the mark at 5.3, but Miller beat that with a 5.2 performance.

Florida State's Sid Gainey took first place honors in the long jump with a 23-7 3/4 leap.

Tom Farrell of St. John's, N.Y., won the 1,000-yard run in 2:09.6; the Southern University mile relay team took first with a 3:14.4 timing, and Richard Ross of Philadelphia high-jumped 6-9 for other new marks.

Roger Mann of Northeast Louisiana tied the old 6.2 standard in the 50-yard high hurdles.
