

Tribe's Smith Sets New Hurdle Record

Florida State's Danny Smith clipped a tenth of a second off his old record of 7.1 in the 60-yard high hurdles last night in the Montgomery Track Club's annual indoor meet.

He was one of several Seminoles who turned in credible performances in the non-scored meet.

The distance medley relay team, composed of Tyrone Frederick, Joel Garren, Bob Brooks, and Bob Burr, won the event in the invitational division.

Frederick won the invitational 880-yard run, and Jeff Nedimyer took the high jump.

Vasco Bradley was third in the invitational 440, Del Ramers fourth in the invitational mile run, Wes Koenig fifth in the 600 run, and Ron Fletcher fifth in the pole vault.

Rudy Falana took fourth in the division I long jump, and Keith Ingram was in a three-way tie in the open division's pole vault.

Florida A&M's Charles Hopkins won the open division 60-yard dash and the Rattlers' Greg Coleman was second in the 60 highs.

In the Olympic Invitational at Madison Square Garden,

Olympic champion Rod Milburn set a world indoor record of 6.8 seconds in the 55-meter hurdles. It was his last performance as an amateur.

Francie Larrieu, a former student at Florida State, smashed the woman's American Indoor 1,500-meter mark at the Olympic meet.
