FSU captures FAMU track as host team

The "leftovers" from Florida State's track team ran up 13 first place finishes to dominate the wet and chilly FAMU

Relays track meet Saturday afternoon.

The Seminoles, who turned out to be the host team when rain forced the meet away from Bragg Stadium's clay track and onto the FSU facilities, were without the services of eight teammates at the NCAA Indoor Championships in Detroit.

But those left behind won more than three times as many events as any other team in the meet. The Seminoles claimed six firsts in the men's division and seven in the women's.

Florida A&M won four events, as did Alabama State. A total of 19 teams competed in the 26th running of the Relays.

George West was FSU's only double winner in the men's division, easily taking the mile and 3-mile runs. Lapping over half the field in the three-mile (including some runners twice), his 13:56.9 time won by almost 45 seconds. His winning mile time was 4:25.6.

Both the 440 relay and sprint medley relay teams won (with times of 41.4 and 3:30.8), along with Mike Woods in the 220-yard dash (22.4)and Henry Finney in the triple jump (49-142.

Laura Ledbetter and Vickie Smith each won two events for Florida State in the women's division. Ledbetter won the high jump (5-foot-2) and the 440 dash (61.7) while Smith took the shot put (42-6) and the 120 high hurdles (15.7).

Other winners were Kim Soergel in the long jump (18-2½), Kim Trayers in the discus (126-9½), and the mile relay team (4:13.5). Soergel also finished third in the high jump (4-6).

For Florida A&M, Ray Herbert won the 100-yard dash in a time of 9.8, Greg Coleman took the 120 high hurdles (13.8) and both the 880 and two-mile relay teams won.

The 880 team, consistin g of Barry Robinson, Herbert, Tom Whitley, and David White, edged out South Carolina State with a time of 1:27.8. And the two-mile relay team of Elias Gore. Sam Johnson, Godfrey Onamym, and Sam Shawney won over Albany State by well over three seconds.

In a special exhibition run, Kenny Harris of South Carolina State blew past former Florida A&M Olympic sprinter Rey Robinson in the 100-meter run. Robinson led up to about the halfway mark, then Harris shot past him to win by 2-10ths of a second.
