# FSU sets world record in hurdles

It may not be run very often, but from now on when it is it will be Florida State's mark that teams will be shooting for.

Propelled by a startling anchor leg by sophomore Leander McKenzie, the FSU 4 x 400-meter hurdles relay team set a world record on Friday to highlight the Domino's Pizza Relays at Florida A&M's track.

"It's our first world record," said FSU Coach Dick Roberts. "And we had to invent an event to get it."

Roberts was only joking, but the event is a rare one. "I saw in a magazine where they ran it a couple of times on the West Coast last year and I thought we ought to run it in the Domino's Relays. There'd be a lot of interest in it."

Roberts' interest was especially aroused because he knew FSU would have four top-notch intermediate hurdlers. All four members of the team — McKenzie, junior Eric Riley, freshman Charlie Carr and junior Larry Newell had run faster than the 52.4 splits it would take to break the record of 3:29.8.

Carr led off the race with a 51.8 leg. Riley, who's better known for his football exploits and has only been in training six weeks, followed with a 52.9. Newell ran a 52.8 that included a strong stretch drive that beat back a surprisingly tough LSU team. McKenzie's 49.5 anchor leg clinched the record with a total time of 3:27.3.

"It feels great," McKenzie said after taking a victory lap with his teammates. "I feel like I'm on top of the world."

Roberts and the hurdlers were quick to credit FSU assistant track coach Jim Long. "It's really as much a tribute to him as anyone," Roberts said. "He's done a terrific job."

A 4 x 400-meter intermediate hurdle race is rarely run because there aren't that many teams with four good intermediate hurdlers. "It's seldom that someone has that much quality and depth," Roberts said. Will the race become a regular feature of the Domino's Relays?

"You better believe it," laughed Roberts. "All four

of those guys will be back next year."

McKenzie also qualified for the NCAA championships when he ran a 13.81 in a 110-meter high hurdles qualifying race. Mississippi's Tony Dees ran the fastest

qualifying time of the day, a 13.72.

Dees' time was a meet record, one of three set Friday. Charlie Simpkins of Liberty Baptist College bounded 54-34 to win the triple jump and Alabama's Siggy Einars-

son threw the javelin 271-6.

Action continues today with field events starting at 9 a.m. and running events at 1 p.m. The feature race might be the 4 x 100-meter relay at 2 p.m.

FSU, which is led off by Greg Allen, qualified eighth in the field with a 40.78. Auburn, with Bo Jackson anchoring, qualified second

with a 40.42.
