

Seminole women claim 7 events in track meet

Florida State's women won seven first places this past weekend in the Cavalier Classic at the University of Virginia.

The Lady Seminoles took the first five places in the 200 meters. Randy Givens won in 22.91, followed by Brenda Cliette (23.26), Marita Payne (23.27), Michelle Finn (23.61) and Janet Davis (24.03). Finn's time qualified her for the Olympic Trials.

In the 100 meters, Finn won in 11.41, Givens was second in 11.43. In the 400 meters, Cliette won in 52.55. Payne was third in 53.30, and Davis fourth in 54.47.

Kelley Hacker qualified for the NCAA Championships by running a 2:07.2 and finishing fourth in the 800-meter run. In the 1,500-meter run Margaret Coomber was second in 4:25.48, Nancy Rettie third in 4:28.19.

Carla Borovicka recovered from a bad fall to take fourth in the 3,000-meter run in 9:36.5

Freshman Joanne Brown won the 110-meter hurdles in 13.96. In the 400-meter hurdles, FSU grad Angie Wright won in 57.34, while FSU's Orville Dwyer-Brown was second (58.28) and Chris McKay was fourth (59.55).

Wendy Markham won the high jump with 5-feet, 8-inches. Marie Roberts got second in the triple jump (35-11 1/2.)

FSU rounded out the day by winning the 4x100-meter relay in 43.33 with a team made up of Cliette, Finn, Payne, Givens.

Hackler, Samantha Green, Dwyer Brown and McKay teamed up for second in the 4x400-meter relay with a time of 3:42.4.

The Lady Seminoles' next action is this weekend in the Gatorade Invitational at the University of Tennessee.
