WARRICK DUNN LEADS FSU MEN AT TEXAS RELAYS

AUSTIN, TX -- Senior Warrick Dunn placed second in the 100-meter dash at the 70th Texas Relays. Dunn was one of five Seminole men to compete in Austin.

After qualifying for the finals with a time of 10.41, Dunn clocked in at 10.34 in the finals to take second place. The time was his fastest of the year and provisionally qualified the All-American for the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Ronnie Powell of Northwestern State won the 100m dash with a mark of 10.29.

Senior Justin Johnston, a two-time All-American from Montana, finished sixth overall in the javelin with a throw of 212-5. Anthony Bolton did not advance to the finals of the 110-meter hurdles with a preliminary time of 14.54, 15th in the event.

The FSU men will continue the outdoor season next weekend (April 11-12) in Orlando at the Florida Intercollegiate. The Seminoles will attempt to defend their "state championship" after winning the team title in 1996.

Dunn second at Texas Relays

AUSTIN, Texas — Florida State's Warrick Dunn ran a 10.34 to place second in the 100-meter dash at the 70th Texas Relays.
