

FSU ladies play here

Florida State's Lady Seminole basketball team, with four victories in its last five games, tries to reach the .500 mark for the first time this season when it swings into action at home on both Friday and Saturday nights.

Friday night the Flyerettes, an AAU outfit from Ft. Walton Beach, visits Tully Gym for a 7 o'clock tipoff. The Saturday contest against South Alabama will serve as the preliminary to the FSU-USA men's contest at 8:05. The women will get underway at 5:45.

"We're just playing a lot better basketball right now," said first-year Lady Seminole coach Dianne Murphy, who watched her club lose its first four games of the season before the current streak that has them at 4-5 on the year. "We're in better physical condition and the girls have had a chance to adjust to my coaching and my philosophy."

FSU women win 104-33

The Florida State Lady Seminoles won their third straight game, crushing Flyerettes of Fort Walton Beach 104-33 in Tully Gym Friday night.

The Lady Seminoles pulled their record even at 5-5, and go for their fourth victory in a row today against South Alabama at 5:45 in Tully.

FSU jumped to a 12-0 lead and overwhelmed the visitor with a 47 per cent shooting performance.

FSU led 56-13 at intermission after holding the Flyerettes scoreless for an 8-minute, 32-second span of time in the first half.

Five players scored in double figures with Tiza Drew leading the way with 18. Stacy Macon and Shirley Silsby hit 12 points each, while Valerie Nelson and Judy Battles chipped in with 10 each.
