LADY SEMINOLES DOWN GEORGIA TECH IN DRAMATIC FASHION

ATLANTA -- It was Carla Williams' putback under the basketball at the buzzer that gave the Florida State women's basketball team a 60-58 victory over Georgia Tech and its second consecutive ACC victory. Williams scored a career-high 20 points and tied her career high in rebounding with 14 boards to lead all players in both catergories tonight at Alexander Coliseum. Florida State improves to 6-13 and 2-6 in the ACC while Georgia Tech fall to an even 9-9 on the season and a 2-5 league mark.

But it wasn't a one-man show that gave FSU its sixth win of the year. A mark that ties last year's total victories. Four Lady Seminoles scored in double figures in the effort. Along with Williams, freshman Wendy Hampton came off the bench to score 12 while freshman Latrice McLin and senior Liberty Taylor contributed 10 apiece.

"I just can't say enough about it," FSU head coach Marynell Meadors said. "This was just a great team win. Carla (Williams) hit the winning basket, but all eight players got us to that point. This is by far the best game we've played all season."

The Lady Seminoles started the contest slow and didn't score their first bucket until the 17:05 mark while Georgia Tech took a convincing 10-2 advantage. But over the next five minutes, Florida State would get into its game and went on a 10-2 run to tie the game and then a Wendy Hampton three-pointer game the Lady Seminoles their first lead (15-14) at the 9:54 mark. The lead would go back and forth for the next few minutes but soon Florida State built an advantage of eight points with 3:00 minutes left in the first half and went into the lockerroom leading, 32-28, at the half.

The second half was all Florida State. At least for the first 12 minutes. The Lady Seminoles built a lead of eight points three times during that period, including a 48-40 advantage with 9:28 to go. But Georgia Tech crawled its way back, as the Lady Jackets went on an 8-0 run and tied the game at 48-48. The remaining seven minutes would see three ties and five lead changes, with neither team leading by more than two points. Down 58-56, the Lady Jackets hit a jumper in the lane with 12 seconds to go to tie the game, giving Florida State one last opportunity to score. After an FSU timeout, senior Allison Peercy inbounded the ball, at the :03 mark, to freshman Lysa Moorefield, who missed a hook shot from the left side. But Williams was there to rebound and put the ball back up at the buzzer. Her feet never touched the ground.

"This was a great win for us," Meadors said. "We beat a very good team team. They are very athletic and have some great scorers."

The victory marked the first consecutive victories for FSU since early in the season on Nov. 29 (Central Florida, Nov. 29) and Dec. 2 (South Florida, 64-45). With the victories, Meadors sees the hard work finally paying off.

"Give this team a little confidence and look what they can do," Meadors said with a smile. "We learned something from all those games we've been struggling in and it is starting to pay off. But one thing has not change. Our effort has been outstanding. Our practices have just been awesome as has our concentration. We are improving more and more each day."

After playing all league teams one time this season, Florida State would start round two at home as the Lady Seminoles play host to Duke on Sat., Jan. 28 and Georgia Tech one week from today. Both games are 7 p.m. starts.
