Moore sets record at Invitational

Record-setting Kathy Moore of host Florida State and Michael Murphy of the University of Florida won the women's and men's university divisions Saturday to highlight the Seventh Annual Cross Country Invitational at Seminole Golf Course.

The meet, billed as the largest in the Southeast, featured competition in six divisions — including a prep division in which Leon's girls ran to a title behind Rose Desloge.

In other divisions, Gainesville's Tim Henry bested a men's open field of 250 runners in finishing the five-mile course in 24:57; five-time Florida Class AAAA cross country champion Largo overwhelmed the boys' high school field; and Seminole Junior College was an easy winner in its division.

Moore was pushed to her course record of 17:15.7 over three miles by women's open division entrants Laura Ledbetter of the FSU Track Club and Nancy Shafer of the Florida Track Club.

The three were bunched within a few yards of each other most of the race with Moore running third in the early going. A closing uphill drive brought the FSU sophomore to victory — only 1.4 seconds ahead of Ledbetter. Shafer, who has dominated women's running in Central Florida for several years, finished third in 17:19.9.

FSU's women easily won the team title, 17-46, over the University of Alabama.

The men's division was highlighted by a duel between Murphy, a UF junior who was 23rd in this year's Boston Marathon, and FSU freshman Herb Wills Wills started slowly over the fivemile men's course but made his way through the pack to pull up to Murphy's shoulder with about a mile left in the race. However, Murphy sprinted into a short lead and then held off Wills' stretch drive to win in 24:32. Wills' time of 24:34, run on a slopply, rain-slicked course, was nearly a minute better than his time over the same course last Saturday.

Murphy helped UF to the men's team title, 27-66, over Valdosta State. FSU finished a strong fifth.

Desloge won by 26 seconds in the girls' high school race, finishing two miles in 11:26.7. Ginger Bryant was fourth and Adrienne Gautier seventh to help Leon to its title.

Marcia Wills of Lincoln finished third in 12:11.4.
