

FSU third in tourney

Florida International, paced by Becky Pearson's course record, jumped into the lead in the Lady Seminole golf tournament Monday at the Florida State course.

Pearson carved out a four-under par 68 for the course record for women in leading International into a six-stroke lead over Miami in the major division. International had a team score of 295 and UM a 301.

Florida State was in third place at the end of the first 18 holes with a score of 307, followed by Georgia at 314 and South Florida at 316.

Miami Dade North was leading the small college-junior college division with a 318. Second was Palm Beach Junior College at 327, followed by Rollins 329, Broward 337 and Florida Atlanta 342.

Pearson had a two-shot lead in the chase for individual honors. Carolyn Hill of Miami was in second place with a 70. Laurie Rusk of Florida State, Mary Duggan of International and Cindy Kessler of UM were all tied for third place with 74s.

UM, Dade-North Win FSU Golf

TALLAHASSEE — The University of Miami women's golf team made up 10 strokes on second-day leader Florida International University and successfully defended its title in the Lady Seminole golf tournament, winning by two shots over FIU Wednesday.

UM totaled 899 to 901 for FIU and 922 for host Florida State. Carolyn Hill of Miami won the individual title for the second straight year, shooting 215. She was followed by FIU's Becky Pearson at 219 and UM's Cindy Kessler at 224.

Miami-Dade Community College North won the small college/junior college division, outdistancing Palm Beach, 929-987. Pam Elders of Dade-North took individual honors with a 227.
