Georgia leads FSU golf tourney

The University of Georgia women's golf team held a 13 point lead over Florida State after the first round of play Monday in the Lady Seminole Invitational at Seminole Golf Course.

Highlight of the first day of competition was a round of 69 by Terry Moody of Georgia, one stroke off the course record for women.

Three Lady Seminoles finished with rounds in the 70s: Michelle Guilbault, 75; and Jane Geddes and Marla Anderson, 78.

Trailing Georgia's 298 points and FSU's 311 were Oklahoma and Palm Beach Community College, 313; Miami-Dade, 314; University of Florida, 317; Alabama and South Florida, 318; Auburn, 320; North Carolina, 322; and Furman, 330.

Georgia leads FSU in women's golf

The University of Georgia women's golf team widened its lead Tuesday over second-place Florida State and the rest of the field after the second round of the Lady Seminole Invitational Golf Tournament. Bulldog Terry Moody continued her torrid pace with a 72 to go with her 69 Monday, for a 141 and five-stroke lead over Nancy Rubin of Florida International University.

Florida State held its second position but fell 17 strokes behind Georgia, 620 to 603. FSU trailed the Bulldogs by 13 after the first round.

Among the Lady Seminoles, Jane Geddes finished two rounds in 152 for fifth place overall; Michelle Guilbault, 155 (10th place), and Marla Anderson, 157 (12th).

Trailing Georgia and FSU were Oklahoma (626), Miami-Dade and the University of Florida (628), Alabama (631), Auburn (634), North Carolina (635), Florida International (637), Palm Beach Community College (640) and Furman (652). Scoring is based on the four best rounds among the five golfers on each team.

Georgia wins Lady Seminole, Florida State places second

The University of Georgia won the Lady Seminole Invitational golf tournament, finishing with a total of 898 Wednesday at the Seminole Golf Course.

Florida State (936) was second and Miami Dade Junior College (941) was third. Alabama, Oklahoma and Florida International tied for fourth at 944.

Georgia's Terry Moody was the top individual, shooting a three-round total of 214. She was followed by Nancy Rubin (216) of FIU and Cincy Pleger (225) of Georgia.

The top finisher for Florida State was Jane Geddes, who shot 228, good for fifth overall. Michelle Guibault of the Lady Seminoles shot 231 for ninth.
