Arizona and Texas Christian are currently tied for first at 305, while FSU is third with 308, Texas is fourth with 310 and Southern Methodist (1979 runner-up in the nationals) is fifth at 314. Florida is tenth with 321.

Other Lady Seminoles' not far off the pace are Jane Geddes with 78, Lisa Young with 79, Marla Anderson 80

and Paula Slivinsky with 83.

Tulsa, who won the nationals on this same course last year is currently seventh at 315, while San Jose State (third in the nationals) is 12th at 323.

FSU women win golf tourney

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.— The Florida State women's golf team, led by Michelle Guilbault, captured the Dick McGuire Invitational Friday. Shooting a team total of 919, the Lady Seminoles finished 12 strokes ahead of second-place Texas Christian.

Defending national champion Tulsa finished in third (935) while national runner-up Southern Methodist (936) and Arizona (937) finished fourth and fifth.

Guilbault was the tournament's top individual finisher with a three-under par total of 218 for three rounds. The next best FSU finisher was Lisa Young with a 231 total.

The victory was FSU's first of the year after finishing second in the Lady Seminole Invitational two weeks ago in Tallahassee.
