FSU women are the choice in Metro golf

Rain or shine, the receptionists always greet callers with "It's a beautiful day at Sandestin."

It probably will be a beautiful weekend there for the Florida State women's golf team. The Lady Seminoles are heavy favorites to win the Metro Conference championship over three other teams.

In a pre-tournament coaches' poll, South Carolina was the only other Metro team to receive a firstplace vote. Coaches aren't allowed to vote for their school, so it's easy to figure out who voted for the Lady Gamecocks.

Whether FSU coach Verlyn Giles actually thinks they can beat his team is another issue. He didn't

seem as concerned about winning as he did about a good showing this weekend.

"We do not necessarily have to win," he said. "But we have to shoot low numbers."

Low numbers would look good when the NCAA decides which teams will make its championship May 25-28 in Las Cruces, N.M. FSU has built a pretty good case for itself, finishing no lower than third in six of the nine tournaments during the season.

FSU is led by senior Sarah Nicklin, who brings a 76.8 average into the tournament. Nicklin's main competition for the individual championship could come from teammates Kathy Grant, Nadin St. Marie, Leigh Ann Miles, Litia Bowman and Kathie Britz.

This is the first women's golf championship in Metro history. Southern Miss, Virginia Tech and Louisville don't even field teams yet. Still, a Metro title is a Metro title, and FSU could use a win.

It has 48.5 points in the Metro's annual race for the All-Sports trophy, signifying the best all-around athletic program in the league. Teams get seven points for first, six for second and so on.

With five sports left, South Carolina has 48 points. It will probably challenge FSU for first-place points in baseball and track, so the golf tournaments — women this week, men next week — are vital to FSU.

FSU women in command

DESTIN — Florida State held a 21-stroke lead Saturday after two days of the first Metro Conference women's golf tournament, which ends today on par-72 the Sandestin Links Course.

With FSU's Leigh Mills (71-78-149) and Nadia Ste-Marie (73-77-150) holding the first two individual places, the Lady Seminoles on Saturday added five strokes to their margin over South Carolina.

FSU shot 299-307-606 to South Carolina's 315-312-627 the first two days. Memphis State was at 638, and Cincinnati shot 960.

Other individual leaders were: Emma Mac-Fie, South Carolina, 152; Sarah Nicklin, FSU, and and Angie Baker, Memphis State, tied at 153; and Cathie Fritz, FSU, 154.

The Lady Seminoles' 299 on Friday was their best score of the year, despite 20-30 mph winds.

FSU women win Metro golf

DESTIN — The Lady Seminoles took first place Sunday in the Metro Conference Golf Championships held at the Sandestin Beach Resort with a score of 909.

South Carolina finished second with 931 and Memphis State was third with 960.

Nadia Ste. Marie birdied the first hole of a sudden death playoff to defeat Leigh Mills and take first place with a final score of 224.

Named to the all-conference team were Mills, who placed second; Cathie Fritz and Sara Nicklin, who tied for third at 231; and Litia Bowman, who tied for ninth place with 240.

Ste. Marie was also named to the all-conference team and received the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award.
