BURCH FINISHES IN 10TH PLACE TO LEAD SEMINOLES TO SIXTH PLACE FINISH AT 17TH ANNUAL ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE WOMEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Florida State sophomore Jaclyn Burch finished in a tie for 10th place and led the Seminole women's golf team to a sixth place finish at the 17th annual Atlantic Coast Conference Championship at the Carmel Country Club. Burch's finished marked the fifth consecutive season a Seminole has finished in the top 10 of the individual standings at the conference championship. Burch shot a two-over par 74 in the final round to earn her first career top 10 finish.

No. 1 ranked Duke won its 10th consecutive ACC Championship as it outdistanced the field by an incredible 47 strokes. The Blue Devils led the event wire-to-wire. Brittany Lang won the individual championship as she led four Blue Devils in the top four individual spots as she closed the championship with a two-under par 70. It was only the second sub par round of the event. It marked the second consecutive season Lang has won the ACC individual championship.

Burch (Wildwood, Mo.) led four Seminole players who finished in the top 30 of the individual standings as she played her best tournament of the spring season. She was nearly flawless during the round as she earned par scores on 16 of 18 holes and bogied only two holes. Burch played the final two rounds of the event at a combined six over par after finishing the first round at nine-over par.

Freshman Whitney Wright (Rockingham, N.C.) earned her second consecutive top-20 individual finish with a five-over par 77 in the final round for a 237 total. She played the final nine holes of the tournament at one-under par. Wright played three of his last six rounds with scores of 75 or better and finished in a tie for fifth (Ryder/Florida Championship) and in 16th (ACC Championship) in the individual standings of her last two events.

Freshman Whitney Brummett (Eureka, Mo.) finished the tournament with a four-over par score of 76 and finished in a tie for 25th place with a 243 total for the 54-hole event. She has now earned five top-25 finishes during her first year at Florida State. Junior Caroline Larsson (Danderyd, Sweden) played her best golf of the championship as she finished play with a 79 and a 254 total. She finished in a tie for 28th place in the individual standings. Senior Tyler Johnson (Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla.) finished in 38th place after carding a 78 in the second round.

Duke Wins Tenth Straight Women's Golf ACC Championship

Brittany Lang Repeats As Individual Champion

Charlotte, N.C. – The No.1-ranked Duke Blue Devils captured their tenth straight Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Golf Championship Sunday at the Carmel Country Club in Charlotte, N.C. Duke's Brittany Lang claimed her second individual championship in as many years, while Duke's Anna Grzebien and Liz Janangelo finished second and third, respectively. Duke's Niloufar Aazam-Zanganeh and Miami's Tina Miller finished tied for fourth.

After a third round four-over 292 performance, the Blue Devils finished with an 886, a 47 point margin of victory, a new conference championship record. Brittany Lang finished two under for the day, the best score by anyone all weekend. She becomes just the second golfer to repeat as the women's conference champion.

The Deacons finished second with a combined 933 for the tournament. It's the Deacons ninth runner-up finish in the last ten years. The Deacons are the last team to have beaten Duke in the ACC Championship (1995). Wake Forest finished the 2005 tournament with three girls in the top-20, including Mandy Goins, who tied for seventh-place after rounds of 73, 81 and 74.

The team from Charlottesville, in just their second year as a golf team, improved from a 2004 seventh place finish to a tied for third place finish in 2005. The Cavaliers pulled within one stroke of second place Wake Forest early in the third round, but finished 11 shots behind the Deacons, with a tournament 944.

The Wolfpack, led by Ashlee Dean's tournament 230, tied for third, with a combined 944. Nancy Mountcastle joined Dean in the top-20, with her tournament 234 and tied for 13th place finish. Dean birdied the last hole to pull the Pack into a tie.

Miami and Florida State, neck and neck throughout the tournament, finished fifth and sixth respectively. In their first year as members of the ACC, the Hurricanes combined for a team tournament score of 946. The Seminoles placed two women in the top half of the field, including Jaclyn Burch whose third round 74 improved her standing to tied for 10th overall.

Ann Laney, sixth overall, led North Carolina to a seventh place finish. The Tar Heels shot their best round of the tournament in the final round (310), despite playing with only four players. Maryland finished eighth overall, led by Jessica Reno's tournament 243.
