**FLORIDA STATE SOCCER RELEASES 2000 SCHEDULE  
(FSU face eight ranked opponents from 1999)**

TALLAHASSEE, FL – The Florida State women's soccer team will host 10 teams and take the road for nine games in the 2000 season. The Seminoles will open the home season against in-state rival Florida Gators and head to Missouri for their first road game of the year.

"We're really excited about the 2000 schedule," Head Coach Patrick Baker said. "Not only will we play in the ACC, which will be strong as always and maybe even stronger, but we're traveling to play teams in the Big 10 (Ohio State), Big 12 (Texas A&M) and Pac-10 (Oregon and Oregon State), which are also big power conferences. We face the strong teams in Florida and Texas A&M like we did last year as well as tough NCAA teams like Missouri and Central Florida."

After opening with three games at home, FSU will head to Columbia, Mo., for the Missouri Tiger Tournament where they will face Ohio State and Missouri, who made an appearance in the NCAA tournament last season. The Seminoles will face eight teams that were ranked in the final NSCAA Top 25 Poll last season and 10 who played in the NCAA Tournament. FSU will host #1 and defending National Champion North Carolina, #6 Clemson, #10 Florida, #11 Texas A&M, #12 Wake Forest, #16 Virginia and will travel to #22 Duke and #23 Maryland.

The Seminoles will also host a tournament this season. The Seminole Soccer Tournament will be September 22-24 and will include Central Florida, Florida International and East Carolina.

"The tournament will be really exciting for us," Baker said. "It will give us an opportunity to bring teams to one of the best facilities in the country and provide some good competitive soccer."

### FSU SOCCER COACH NAMED REGIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR AND RUNNER-UP NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Emma Breland named Southeast Region freshman of the year.

Tallahassee, FL – The No. 12 Florida State soccer team continued to garner post-season awards Wednesday when *SoccerBuzz* named head coach Patrick Baker Southeast Region coach of the year and runner-up for national coach of the year honors. Emma Breland won Southeast Region freshman of the year and was named first team All-Southeast Region. Breland was also placed on the Southeast Region All-Freshman team. Three other Seminoles, Marte Vik Edvardsen, Rachael Watkin and Sarah Crawford, were named second team All-Southeast Region.

Baker, in his second year at the helm of the FSU soccer program, led the Seminoles to their first-ever NCAA bid and guided the team to an appearance in the Sweet 16. Under Baker's leadership, Florida State achieved 20 program firsts in 2000 including being the first team to ever beat the last two national champions in one season (Florida and North Carolina), the program's first-ever win over a top 5 opponent (North Carolina 3-2 OT), its first-ever national ranking and Florida State's first-ever victory over six teams.

"This is great news and very deserving recognition," said Florida State Athletic Director Dave Hart. "I am very proud of the leadership Patrick Baker has demonstrated in his very brief tenure at Florida State University. It is good to see that his peers, not only regionally but nationally recognize the outstanding job he has done."

Southeast region freshman of the year Emma Breland has been among the ACC's league leaders all season long and was the first Seminole to ever be named All-ACC first team. Breland owns the FSU record for points in a season and assists in a season and she ranks second on FSU's list for most goals in a season and is now second in game-winning goals in a season (5) and a career. She also owns every freshman record in Florida State history. Breland has appeared on the Soccer America Team of the Week twice this season, she was named first team All-Southeast Region and she was also named to the All-Freshman team. Breland was also a finalist for *SoccerBuzz* national freshman of the year honors.

"Our whole freshman class helped this program get to a point where we were able to reach the Sweet 16," said Baker. "We needed a large influx of youth and talent and last year's recruiting class lived up to the expectations of their top 13 ranking. Emma was the gem of the group and she has brought a lot of recognition to our program. With the team recognition has come some individual recognition for the role she played in our unprecedented success this year. It is very exciting that she is considered one of the top seven freshmen in the country this year."

Seniors Rachael Watkin and Sarah Crawford and junior Marte Vik Edvardsen were named All-Southeast Region second team. Watkin is the all-time leader in starts for FSU and she is second in all-time game appearances. She has started every match she has appeared in and she always played big in FSU's biggest games. Two of her three goals came in a 4-1 win against No. 8 Texas A&M (the game-winner) and an equalizer just after halftime against No. 5 Clemson. Watkin also came through with an assist against the Aggies and she assisted on the equalizer in a 3-2 win over then-No. 2 North Carolina.

She was named to the All-ACC tournament team after scoring a goal and the game-winning PK against Wake at the ACC's.

Sarah Crawford became the first goalkeeper in Florida State history to start every minute of every game this season. Crawford is second in shutouts and first in minutes played in a single season and she is the first Florida State goalkeeper to ever record three consecutive shutouts. She allowed only 28 goals this season shattering the previous record of 35 set in 1996. Crawford garnered All-ACC tournament honors after only allowing one goal against Wake Forest and making a diving shoot-out save that allowed FSU to advance in the tournament for the first time in school history.

Marte Vik Edvardsen is one of only four Seminoles to start every game this season and she was a factor in almost every one of Florida State's top 20 victories this season. She assisted on the first goal against Texas A&M just 3:42 into the match and also scored Florida State's first-ever goal against the Tar Heels. Her penalty kick answered North Carolina's first goal and kept the Seminoles alive in the biggest upset in the school's history. Marte also scored two goals in the 3-1 win against Miami and that victory assured FSU of its best regular season record ever.

"I am very excited for the three players that were recognized by *SoccerBuzz*," said Baker. "Marte may not of stood out so much this season because she was surrounded with more talent than last year but she is so important to our program. I am also very happy Rachael and Sarah were recognized for their roles in our success this season. It was a wonderful accomplishment for all of these players and it's a reflection of what we were able to accomplish this season."

Freshman continues to garner post-season honors after record-breaking season.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – One day after being named the Southeast Region freshman of the year, Emma Breland was named Florida State soccer's first-ever All-American garnering third team honors from *SoccerBuzz*. The freshman from Trelleborg, Sweden was one of only five freshmen to appear on the All-American list and she joined nine other ACC players as a *SoccerBuzz* All-American.

"I am very excited that our players are starting to get some of the national recognition they deserve," said head coach Patrick Baker. ### FSU'S BRELAND CONTINUES TO GARNER POSTSEASON HONORS

First-year star named to *Soccer America* All-Freshman Team

Tallahassee, FL – After scoring 12 goals, recording seven assists, tallying 31 total points and helping the 12<sup>th</sup>-ranked Seminoles advance to the sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament, freshman Emma Breland received another honor Tuesday. The first-year star from Trelleborg, Sweden was named to the *Soccer America* all-freshman team.

"It is a huge honor for Emma and a huge honor for our program," said head coach Patrick Baker. "She had about as good of a freshman season as one could hope for and I think so many highly-touted freshmen enter college each year and don't live up to their billing but that wasn't the case with Emma. We didn't ask her to do a whole lot but once she came here and we established her role, she filled that role perfectly. Its great to see one of our players recognized at the highest level."

"I think this latest honor continues to illustrate the strength of the ACC," said Baker. "The fact that we had four teams in the sweet 16 and we've got more than a third of the all-freshman team in our conference speaks volumes about the continual attraction the nation's top players have with our conference. A majority of the best players still come to the ACC and I think that will once again be reflected come signing day."

### FLORIDA STATE SOCCER CELEBRATES 2000 SEASON AT ANNUAL BANQUET

Seminoles have more to celebrate after the programs first Sweet 16 berth.

Tallahassee, FL – There hasn't always been too much to celebrate at the annual season-ending soccer banquet at Florida State University. The coaches would show how much they appreciated the team's hard work, especially the seniors, and everyone's attention would quickly turn to next season. What a difference a year makes. When the 12<sup>th</sup>-ranked Seminoles got together at The Silver Slipper restaurant in Tallahassee, FL to hand out its awards for 2000, there were national honors, top 15 rankings and NCAA Tournament appearances to celebrate.

Florida State Director of Athletics Dave Hart and Senior Associate Athletic Director Kim Record joined head coach Patrick Baker as the FSU soccer staff rewarded its players for turning in the most successful season in the short history of FSU soccer and completing one of the greatest turnarounds in Florida State athletic history. The Seminoles went from a perennial last-place team in the ACC to a squad that knocked off 1999 and 2000 National Champion North Carolina, defeated 1998 National Champion Florida on two occasions, beat top 20 opponents Texas A&M and Wake Forest and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

"When you get caught up in the excitement of a season like we had in 2000 you sometimes don't take the time to acknowledge all the players and support staff that put us in position to achieve so much on the field," said head coach Patrick Baker. "The banquet is a great opportunity for the coaches to let the players know how much we appreciate the hard work they put in everyday that allowed this group to change this program into something the whole university can be proud of."

One of the main purposes of any season ending banquet is to honor the seniors since it is the last time the team will be together as it was everyday for the entire 2000 season. April Murphy, Rachael Watkin, Ashley Halter and Dee Foard went through a coaching change, losing seasons and playing on intramural fields with very little fan support to the unprecedented success of 2000. Sarah Deacon and Sarah Crawford transferred in and joined a senior class that turned FSU into a top 15 program that can now compete in the nation's premier soccer conference and they laid the foundation for what will be one of the nation's top programs for years to come.

"It is almost impossible to describe what this group of seniors did for this program," said Baker. "Years from now we all expect to look back at this group of seniors as the class that forever established Florida State as a player on the national soccer stage. Tonight was our last opportunity to let them know that we won't forget their contributions to this program."

The seniors were each individually recognized by Baker and then collectively accepted a NSCAA plaque recognizing the team's No. 14 national ranking in the organization's season-ending poll. It was the first time in the school's history that the women's soccer program finished a season nationally ranked. The team also received NCAA certificates proclaiming its first-ever appearance in the Women's Division I soccer tournament.

Coach Baker also rewarded all of the players who were honored with special recognition from the NSCAA, *SoccerBuzz* and the Atlantic Coast Conference. Emma Breland received recognition for being named a *SoccerBuzz* national freshman of the year finalist, named *SoccerBuzz* southeast region freshman of the year, FSU's first *SoccerBuzz* All-American selection, a *SoccerBuzz* All-Southeast Region first team, a member of the *SoccerBuzz* Southeast Region All-Freshman team, a member of the

*Soccer America* All-Freshman team, All-Southeast Region second team NSCAA, All-ACC first team and All-ACC freshman team. *SoccerBuzz* All-Southeast Region second team selections (Rachael Watkin, Sarah Crawford and Marte Vik Edvardsen) and All-ACC Tournament selections (Rachael Watkin and Sarah Crawford) were also honored.

The coaching staff also handed out their own awards for this year's team. Christy Peacock won the Red Dog Award for the team's hardest worker and the ultimate team player. Peacock appeared in 10 matches this season and was part of a Seminole defense that had the best defensive season in the history of the program. Peacock, and the rest of FSU's defense, limited opponents to just 31 goals on the season. That beat the old record set in 1996 by 4 goals and the Noles played four more games (one ACC Tournament game and three NCAA Tournament). The defense also recorded 5 shutouts and tied the record for consecutive shutouts in a season (3).

The Coaches Award went to Sarah Crawford who became the first goalkeeper in Florida State history to start every minute of every game last season. Crawford is second in shutouts (6) and first in minutes played (2,273) in a single season and she is the first Florida State goalkeeper to ever record three consecutive shutouts. She, and the Seminole defense, allowed only 31 goals this season shattering the previous record of 35 set in 1996.

The Most Improved Player Award went to sophomore Cindy Schofield. Arguably one of the most important offensive players in Florida State's turnaround last season, Schofield was tied for first in assists (7), was second in points (17) and was tied for second in goals scored (5). She also had two game-winning assists and recorded an assist in FSU's 4-1 win over Texas A&M. Schofield was a key factor on the road where she tallied four of her six assists (Duke, Miami, Oregon State and Missouri).

Meredith Jones was tabbed by the coaching staff as the Seminoles Defensive MVP for the 2000 season. One of only four players to start every match for FSU this year, Jones was continually counted on to provide solid play in the back for FSU but has also been effective getting forward and assisting the Seminole offense. She recorded assists in four games including two important ACC battles. She assisted on the second goal in a big 2-0 win against Wake Forest and also recorded an assist on FSU's first goal against Clemson.

Freshman sensation Emma Breland captured Rookie of the Year and Offensive MVP honors at the banquet. Arguably the best freshman in the ACC last season, Breland was among the conference's league leaders all season long and was the first Seminole to ever be named All-ACC first team. She personally set 10 program firsts and also re-wrote the Florida State record books. She owns every FSU freshman record and is currently second on FSU's list for most goals in a season and first in points scored in a season. Breland ranks second in game-winning goals in a season (5) and a career. She has appeared on the Soccer America Team of the Week twice this season.

Senior Rachael Watkin was a major reason the Seminoles had such an unbelievable season and she garnered Most Valuable Player honors for the 2000 season despite switching positions at the start of the year. Considered the Iron Woman of Florida State soccer, Watkin is the all-time leader in starts for FSU and she is second in all-time game appearances. She has started every match she has appeared in and she always plays big in FSU's biggest games. She scored the first goal just five minutes into FSU's 2-1 win over Florida in the second round of the NCAA Tournament and two of her three other goals came in a 4-1 win against No. 8 Texas A&M (the game-winner) and an equalizer just after halftime against No. 5 Clemson. Watkin also came through with an assist against the Aggies and Jacksonville in Florida State's first-ever NCAA Tournament game and she assisted on the equalizer in a 3-2 win over then-No. 2 North Carolina. Scored a goal and the game-winning PK against Wake at ACC's. It marked the first time in the history of Seminole soccer that the Seminoles advanced to the second round of the ACC Tournament.
