NO. 17 FLORIDA STATE DOWNS KANSAS 4-1 TO MOVE TO 4-2 ON SEASON

Four different goal scorers help Seminoles comeback from early deficit against Jayhawks.

Tallahassee, FL – In what has become a trademark for Florida State soccer under head coach Patrick Baker, the Seminoles staged their fifth come-from-behind victory in the last two seasons Friday evening. After Kansas (3-2-0) took an early lead in the IIth-minute, FSU (4-2-0, I-0-0) staged its second straight comeback dominating play in scoring four unanswered goals and downing Kansas 4-I in front of 644 fans at the Seminole Soccer Complex.

"The first half was very tough," said Baker. "Kansas came in organized and playing well and scored a very well-taken goal just 10 minutes in. For us to not play as well as we would of liked all game but get a result, just like we did at Clemson says something about this team but it isn't the standard we are trying to set. We want to be one of the best teams in the country and we are not playing like one right now. We are a good team but not a great one yet."

Kansas pressured the Seminoles early in the game. In the seventh-minute the Jayhawks just missed an opportunity to break on top of FSU when they slipped in behind the Seminole defense and pushed a shot just wide of the Florida State net. Just over three minutes later, Kansas' Rachel Griffin found Hilla Rantala who beat Kerry York at the near post recording her fifth goal of the season and staking KU to a I-O lead.

The goal seemed to stir the Seminoles as they went on to start to dictate play after the Jayhawks early lead. In the 19th-minute freshman Camie Bybee sent Maren Vik Edvardsen into the Kansas 18-yard box where she beat a defender and was then pulled down by the Jayhawk defense. Senior Heather Dyche sent the penalty kick into the lower corner at the left post to even the match at I-I. The goal represented Dyche's fifth point of the season after accumulating just six total points for her entire FSU career entering 2001.

"If I am able to help this team and provide assists and goals on free kicks, I am obviously going to take advantage of that," said Dyche. "You have to have confidence in yourself when you are taking penalty kicks. It is just you against one person and it is up to you to make that shot so you have to have confidence."

After a flurry of dangerous opportunities within a few minutes of one another to start the second half, Florida State eventually took the lead in the 67th-minute when senior Maren Vik Edvardsen played a ball back to freshman Camie Bybee about 20 yards out. Bybee made a little space for herself and then launched a shot to the far post that beat Jayhawk keeper Meghan Miller to the top corner of the net. The goal was the team-leading third of the season for the Oklahoma Gatorade Player of the Year and wound up being the first game-winner of her FSU career.

"I am just happy I can contribute to the team and finally start to put away some of my opportunities," said Bybee. "It is exciting to get the first game-winner of my career here. I think I am finally staring to fit in to the team. It took me awhile to get used to everyone's style but now I think I have adjusted well and I'm starting to play like I know I can."

Vik Edvardsen, who recorded her third assist on Bybee's goal, recorded her fourth of the season almost four minutes later when she sent a corner kick into the box that sophomore defender Kristin Boyce headed home for her second goal of the season, which matched her total for all of last year. Vik

Edvardsen's team-leading fourth assist matches a career high set in 2000 and put FSU up 3-I with just under 20 minutes to play.

The Seminoles extended their lead in the 80th-minute when junior Cindy Schofield moved into a tie for the team lead in goals with her third of the season. Freshman Jez Ratliff found Schofield at the top of the 18 as she used an inside-outside move to free herself from the KU defense and blasted a shot to the upper corner of the back post. Schofield, the second all-time leading high school goal scorer in the United States, is now just two goals shy of equaling her total from a breakout 2000 campaign when she scored five goals and recorded seven assists.

Although Florida State fell behind early, the Seminoles dictated much of the play after the first ten minutes and dominated the Jayhawks for most of the match. Florida State took II shots on goal compared to three for Kansas, they had II corner kicks compared to just two for the Jayhawks and much of the game in the second half was played on the Jayhawks half of the field.

"We still have a lot of work to do," said Baker. "We still gave up an early goal, which is something we have been trying to remedy. We manufactured a penalty kick tonight and then the game changed. We talked at halftime that we had 45 minutes and the game was in the balance. I told our team at times we play some very good soccer but we have a lot of work to do."

After going nearly three weeks without playing a home game, FSU turns around and faces NC State at home Sunday at 1:00 p.m. in a game that will be regionally televised by the Sunshine Network. The Seminoles started their conference schedule with a win at No. 7 Clemson Monday and have an opportunity to go 2-0 in the ACC for the first time ever against a Wolfpack squad that enters the match with a 2-3-0 record and is 0-1-0 in the conference.

"I would love to have three more training sessions before we face NC State," said Baker. "Unfortunately, we will only be able to watch video and walk through some things between now and then but this game gives our program a great opportunity to go into uncharted waters and possibly move to 2-0 in the ACC."
