### HEAD COACH - JoAnne Graf

In just four seasons as head coach of Florida State, JoAnne Graf has achieved what most coaches only dream about—winning the national championship. Graf accomplished that feat at the end of the 1981 season as she guided the Florida State ten to a 54-7 record and the AIAW National Championship title, the first ever by a Florida State team.

The 1981 Coach of the Year in Florida, Graf may well be on her way to repeating last season's incredible accomplishments. During the 1982 season, Graf has paced FSU to a 52-10 record going into the national tournament—which has allowed Florida State to go into the national championships with the number one seed.

Graf has coached Florida State to victories in the Regional and State championships this past season; as well as first place finishes in the Florida Invitational, Friendly Cities Invitational, South Florida Invitational and the North Carolina State Invitational.

Graf is one of the few coaches in the nation that can claim 100 coaching wins in just two seasons, compiling a 106-17 record during the 1981 and 1982 seasons. Her overall mark at Florida State now reads 169-42 for four seasons.

## 1982 SEASON SUMMARY

To say Florida State had another outstanding year in softball in 1982 would be a terrific understatement. FSU had an awesome year. Despite losing starting pitcher Sue Painter to a knee injury for well over one third of the 1982 season, FSU still was able to win three invitationals and both the state and AIAW Region III crowns.

FSU started the season strong winning its first 12 games, including eight by shutout. Five of the wins came at Gainesville and gave Florida State its first Invitational win at the Lady Gator Classic.

All would not go well for the Lady Seminoles for the next 20 games however.

In the 13th game of the season, Painter injured her knee. The injury forced

Florida State to experiment for the next 23 games, with short stop Darby Cottle

and second baseman Jan Sikes each drawing pitching assignments.

The makeshift line up resulted in FSU losing three games in a row and finishing only fourth at the Lady Seminole Invitational. FSU came on strong to capture both the Friendly Cities Invitational and the South Florida Invitational, before placing second in the Montgomery Invitational.

With Painter back in the lineup, FSU began to play like the team of old, as it rolled up victories in the North Carolina State Invitational and both the state and regional tournaments. At the North Carolina Lady Wolfpack tournament, Florida State became the first FSU team to go through an entire tournament to without allowing a run to be scored against them.

Despite the high scoring nature of the game, FSU has always displayed strong defense and a powerful offense. During the past season, FSU has outscored opponents 596 (9.61 average) to just 218 (3.52 average). The 1982 Lady Seminoles have held opponents scoreless 18 times; while only being shutout once.

- 3. South Florida--Teams met nine times during the regular and post season in 1982. FSU took seven of the meetings, winning two by shut out. South Florida took a 6-0 win at Tampa earlier. FSU leads overall series 22-7.
- 4. Western Carolina--Teams did not meet in regular season. FSU leads all-time series, 2-0.

Winners of the Broderick Award are selected by a national poll of women's athletic directors and are judged for excel-

# FSU's Darby Cottle selected country's best in softball

Last night a tearful Darby Cottle accepted the 1982 Broderick Award for slow pitch softball—which named her the best softball player in the country.

Cottle, a senior at Florida State University, was presented the award given only to 16 female athletes in the country each year. Cottle was selected by a poll of athletic directors nation wide.

"Darby is an example of the kind of athletes we have at FSU and we're proud of her," Barbara Palmer, FSU's women's athletic director said.

By being selected for the Broderick Award, Cottle is now eligible for the Broderick Cup. The Broderick Cup is to women athletes what the Heisman trophy is to male athletes.

Cottle is expected to play her last year at FSU, if in fact there is a season. Since the change over from the AIAW women's athletics to the NCAA, which does not sanction slow-pitch, the future of women's slow-pitch softball at FSU is unknown. No word has come yet from the NCAA as to whether FSU and other schools will have to end their slowpitch programs and switch to fast-pitch, or pick up an entirely different sport.
