

FSU 19th in AIAW

DURHAM, N.C. — Florida State's women set three school records and pulled into a tie for 19th place Thursday after the first day of the AIAW national swim championships at Duke University.

Jana Wilkins placed 7th in the 100-butterfly with a time of 56.92 and also helped the 200-medley relay team to a 14th place (1:50.70) and the 800-freestyle relay team to a 14th (7:47.98). Laura Barber, Jeanne Dowdle and Jackie Bajus helped the 200-

medley team qualify while Lisa Davidson replaced Bajus to anchor the team in the final. The 800-free-style, which shattered the old FSU mark by five seconds, was swum by Wilkins, Sara Shuster, Bajus and Terri Miller.

All of those swimmers received All-America status.

FSU is tied with Clemson for 19th and is only two points out of 15th place. Arizona State leads the meet with Florida second and Miami third. The meet concludes Saturday.

Miller makes all-America

DURHAM, N.C. — Terri Miller of Florida State finished 11th in the 400-yard individual medley at the Duke University pool here Friday night in the Women's Collegiate National Championships. By finishing in the top 16, she becomes a collegiate all-American.

Miller's time of 4:34.66 sets a new school record.

FSU is ranked 22nd overall with 30 points, one point behind Hawaii and two behind Texas, with one day to go in the competition.

Florida is second and Miami is third in the team competition.

Laura Barber set an FSU school record in the 100 backstroke with a 1:00.67, and the 400 medley relay team of Barber, Miller, Jeanne Dowdle and Jana Wilkins broke a school record and finished 17th in the competition with a 4:03.33.
